## Financial Aid Policy

Students graduating spring 2018 and beyond must have taken one of the following steps as part of their graduation requirements:

- Submit the <u>FAFSA</u>
- Complete the <u>Louisiana TOPS form</u>
- Submit an opt-out <u>non-participation form</u>
- Receive a <u>waiver</u> through school system

Several resources are available on the <u>Financial Aid web page</u> to support schools in ensuring students meet this graduation requirement.

LOSFA's <u>Complete to Compete</u> tool is a way to track school *completion* rates.

### Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- Students will be able to submit a 2019-2020 FAFSA as early as October 1, 2018.
- The financial aid application process is more aligned with the college application process.
- Students could potentially be eligible for additional federal, state, institutional aid.

### **FAFSA**

- School counselors should begin speaking to students about the benefits and financial costs associated with postsecondary education and training in their freshmen and sophomore years of high school.
- School counselors and students should be informed about the circumstances in which a student may complete a FAFSA and receive financial aid without his/her parents' cooperation.
- Schools should seek out partnerships with Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance (LOSFA), higher education institutions, and financial aid assistance groups to assist with the FAFSA process.

## **FAFSA Completion Success Strategies**

- Superintendents, supervisors, and principals should stress the importance and benefits of completing the application to students and parents.
- Remind parents about FAFSA with "Save the Date" cards.
- Send out robo calls along with text messages to remind students.
- Offer some time during the school day for parents to stop in to receive assistance.
- Offer T-shirts or food.

## **FAFSA Completion Success Strategies**

- JAG Specialist assistance
- Start talking to parents about FAFSA completion in August or September
- Hold Senior/Graduation Night after October 1 and incorporate FAFSA
- School or classroom competitions
- Partner with athletic events to encourage parent participation
- Partner with financial aid assistance groups: LOSFA, LELA, Career Compass, etc.
