The Charter Request for Applications Evaluation Rubric, used as a guide for reviewing and evaluating charter applications by the third-party independent evaluator, has been updated for the 2025-2026 RFA Cycle.

Guidelines regarding the utilization of the rubric:

- Local authorizers may use these standards in the local evaluation process, but are not required.
- Charter applicants typically use these standards as a guide throughout the development of the charter application and as a rubric against which to evaluate the completeness and quality of the charter application.
- The Louisiana Department of Education uses these standards as the basis for the third-party review conducted by an independent third-party team of reviewers.

The Charter Application Evaluation Rubric includes two sets of standards:

- Standards that apply to specific pieces of evidence presented in the application, and
- Founding Team Capacity Interview standards that apply to board members and the school leader(s) through interview and performance task measures.

K-3 Numeracy Screener

- The Department is working across offices to create and administer a K-3 Numeracy Screener that is consistent with the purpose and design of the K-3 Literacy Screener. This is in alignment with Act 650 (2024) and Bulletin 118 policy.
- The K-3 Numeracy Screener will first be administered in 2025-2026 as a part of a Learning Year and operational in 2026-2027. All K-3 sites will administer the K-3 Numeracy Screener throughout the 2025-2026 school year.



Numeracy Alternate Assessment Rubric (NAAR) Overview

- Alternate assessment to the K-3 Numeracy Screener for students with significant cognitive disabilities (SWSCD) in kindergarten – 3rd grade
 - Only for students whom the Individualized Education Program (IEP) team has used the K-2 Alternate Assessment Decision Making Tool or the 3-11 Alternate Assessment Criteria to determine eligibility should be scored on the numeracy screener using the NAAR



Numeracy Alternate Assessment Rubric (NAAR) Procedures for Administering

- The special educator should begin to complete the rubric by first reviewing the rubric strands and determining the student's ability level
- The test administrator should utilize daily curriculum materials to assess the student and assign NAAR scores from "Not Yet Emerging" (1 point), "Emerging" (2 points), "Approaching Target" (3 points), "At Target" (4 points), and "Skill Accuracy" (5 points)

Transition Planning Guidance for IEP Teams

Defining Transition Services

Transition services are a coordinated set of activities for students with disabilities, designed as a results-oriented process to improve academic and functional achievement. The goal is to facilitate movement from school to post-school activities, including:

- Postsecondary education
- Vocational education
- Integrated employment (including supported employment)
- Continuing and adult education
- Adult services
- Independent living
- Community participation

These services are based on the individual student's needs, considering their strengths, preferences, and interests. They include instruction, related services, community experiences, development of employment and other post-school adult living objectives, and, when appropriate, acquisition of daily living skills and functional vocational evaluation. Transition services are outlined in Louisiana Bulletin 1706, Subchapter B §300.43; IDEA 34 CFR §300.43.

- CSP Subgrant Application Due September 9, 2025

Any charter group submitting an LOI will be invited to participate in CSP Technical Assistance sessions prior to the due date for the Eligibility Form.

Please note that this cycle has been expanded to allow for applications from operators that have not previously been eligible for the Year 1 and Year 2 cycles.

Charter School Program Grant Updates

We continue to host the Excellence in Authorizing Community of Practice. Districts participating in the 2025 cohort will be eligible to receive reimbursement for the following:

- Travel to attend <u>NACSACON 2025</u>
- Cost of third-party review of charter applications
