Date	Action
January 10, 2025	LEAP Connect: Deadline to finalize IEPs for students assessed on LEAP Connect, including eligibility. If you have any questions or require further information, contact assessments@la.gov .
January 15, 2025	Periodic Expenditure Reports in eGMS for all grants are due: The Periodic Expense Report is used to record year-to-date expenses by program and year. The report for December 31st will be due January 15th. If you have any questions or require further information, contact LDOE.FederalClaims@la.gov .
January 15, 2025	Teacher and Principal of the Year Application: School Systems/Coordinators are required to enter state-level honoree information in the Teacher and Principal of the Year Coordinator's Online Portal. State-Level Candidates are to submit applications in the Teacher and Principal of the Year Candidate's Online Application Portal. All applications and materials are posted on the resource page. Candidates submitting a state-level application and coordinators are encouraged to join an informational webinar PDF. If any issues are anticipated or encountered when submitting applications, candidates may complete the Online Portal Help Desk Form. January 31, 2025	Quarter 2 Financial Report: Charter Schools are required to annually submit the budgeted data for the fiscal year along with the YTD actual data from October 1-December 31. Each quarterly and annual financial report should include a statement from the charter operator's lead executive and Board President certifying the accuracy of the report and the adherence to the operator's Internal Control procedures. The charter operator must maintain records in compliance with generally accepted accounting principles. The financial report should be submitted to charterfinancehelpdesk@la.gov . February 7, 2025	Diploma and Seal Orders: Each school system or charter management organization must submit one order for all diplomas and endorsement seals. The order should account for all schools with the specified system for the academic year. The form should be submitted online using the 2024-2025 Diploma and Seal Order Form. 2025-2026 Mid-Year Charter School Application Process Timeline To begin operation in 2026-27

June 11, 2025	LDOE application opens for Type 2, 4, and 5 applicants.
June 30, 2025	Letters of Intent due to LDOE.
July 7, 2025	Eligibility Determination Forms Due to LDOE.
July 18, 2025	LDOE submission deadline for the full application for Types 2, 4, and 5 applicants.
September 2025	Capacity Interviews for Type 2, 4, and 5 applicants conducted by 3rd Party Reviewer.
December 9, 2025	Types 2, 4, and 5 Applicants: BESE considers applications for new charter schools.



- When deciding whether to approve or deny a charter school application, authorizers should consider the following:
 - Proposed program's quality and innovation;
 - School ability to meet needs of targeted student population;
 - Financial sustainability;
 - Leadership team experience;
 - Impact on local district;
 - Community support; and
 - Plan for academic accountability and performance measurement

- Academic Program
 - Is the curriculum in alignment with state standards?
 - Do the instructional methods include strategies for diverse learners?
 - What assessments will be utilized to analyze data and how will student progress be monitored?
 - What is the plan to address gaps in student achievement?



- School Leadership and Governance
 - What are the qualifications and experience levels of the school leadership team? How does this inform the authorizer of their capabilities?
 - What is the governance structure and how are the accountability mechanisms assigned by the board?
 - What is the operator's capacity to manage operations and finances?



- Student Population and Need
 - How will the proposed school address the specific needs of the community?
 - What is the potential impact on student diversity within the district?



- Financial Sustainability
 - How does the budget projection align with the minimum foundation program for district?
 - What is the plan for managing operational costs?
 - What are the strategies for attracting and retaining students?



- Community Support
 - In terms of engagement and outreach, what mechanisms for input from local community members did the operator utilize?
 - What is the level of support from the local district and community leaders?
 - What is the level of support from parents and community stakeholders?



- Impact on Existing Schools
 - What level of impact will the proposed school have on local district enrollment?
 - What level of impact will the proposed school have on resource allocation to local district schools?
 - What are some strategies that could be implemented to avoid impacting the overall district performance?



- Accountability and Oversight
 - Are there clear performance metrics and accountability measures outlined by the operator?
 - Is there a plan for scheduled monitoring and interventions when warranted?
 - What is the process for addressing any areas of concern and/or non-compliance?



- Key Considerations for Denial
 - Does the application lack a well-defined educational program or clear academic goals?
 - Is the financial plan insufficient or indicates potential for fiscal instability?
 - Will the proposed school have a negative impact on the existing local school district or community?
 - Has the operator failed to demonstrate student need?
 - Are there concerns regarding the proposed school's ability to meet state standards and/or accountability requirements?
 - Are there concerns regarding the qualification of the leadership team or governance structure?

- The Open Meetings Law, found in R.S. 42:12 42:28, regulates meetings of public bodies.
- The Open Meetings Law is meant to ensure that decisions by the government are made in an open forum.
- The Open Meetings Law operates in conjunction with Louisiana's Public Records Law to insure compliance with Article XII, Section 3 of the Louisiana Constitution, which mandates that "No person shall be denied the right to observe the deliberations of public bodies and examine public documents, except in cases established by law."

- A meeting is a convening of a quorum of a public body to deliberate or act on a matter that the public body has supervision, control, jurisdiction, or advisory power over.
 - Quorum-a simple majority of the total membership of a public body.
 Vacant positions must be counted in determining a quorum and will not reduce the number of members required to be present to conduct business. No official action may be undertaken by the body in the absence of a quorum of the body.

Meetings of public bodies are required to:

- Notice of the meeting at least 24 hours before the meeting
- Allow for some means of public comment;
- Allow for recording of the meeting by the audience;
- Record minutes of the proceedings; and
- Have "open" meetings that is, observable to the public with an opportunity for public participation.
- A copy of the Open Meetings Law must also be posted at the location of the meeting.
- School boards are required to allow public comment before taking any vote.

Meeting Requirements in relation to Charter RFA Process

- Per La. Bulletin 126 (Section 306): Local school boards, as the authorizer of type 1 and type 3 charter schools, have the following authorizing responsibilities:
 - 4. Prior to approving a charter for a Type 1 or Type 3 school, to hold a public meeting for the purpose of considering the proposal and receiving public input. Such meeting shall be held after reasonable efforts have been made by the local school board to notify the public of the meeting and its content.



Educator Evaluation Updates



2023-2024 Evaluation Close-Out

All 2023-2024 evaluations will be closed out in the <u>COMPASS Information</u> <u>System (CIS)</u>.

- The deadline to <u>enter</u> or edit teacher, counselor, and librarian evaluation data was **November 29**.
- The deadline to <u>enter</u> or edit leader evaluation data is **January 31**.

2024-2025 Evaluation Data Reporting

Louisiana Evaluation System (LES) is replacing the Compass Information System (CIS). <u>LES</u> is live and all 2024-2025 evaluation data can now be entered into LES. Even if using legacy systems (COMPASS or approved alternate observation tools) rather than transitioning to LEADS, data will be entered into LES. There will be no spreadsheet uploads, nor will EEpass roll into the new data system.

Some notes about LES:

- Rosters pre-populate from EdLink.
- Users will access <u>EdLink Security</u> for LES.
- Evaluators and evaluatees will enter data.
- Data will be entered throughout the school year.



LEADS Evaluation Support

MFP Child Count

The Department annually collects the number of students receiving special education and related services for state reporting and funding. These counts include students with disabilities and gifted and talented students. Students must have a current evaluation, IEP, and receiving services as of the child count date.

Refer to the <u>Benchmark Calendar</u> for reports to run and verify data. The official MFP Child Count will run on **February 20**.



April Dunn Act Monitoring

School systems are required to complete the April Dunn Act self-assessment to ensure effective implementation. The self-assessment must be completed by February 28.

Self-assessment results should be kept on file. The Department will audit self-assessment results to ensure they accurately represent best practices in the implementation of the April Dunn Act.

Resources to support effective implementation are available in the Students with Disabilities library.


Don't forget to <u>register</u> for the January sessions in the appropriate learning pathway based on their professional role. Special education directors will register for the Instructional Coherence Pathway.
