



# Pandemic Electronic Benefits Transfer (P-EBT) and Local Level Funding



## P-EBT Fund Expungement


All federal benefits issued (including P-EBT) by DCFS have a 9-month time limit for use.

The timer is reset to 9 months each time a purchase is made.

Families were sent letters to inform recipients that they have benefits that will soon expire. If they make a purchase, the timer will be reset. If they don't, any remaining benefits will be lost.

However, the card and the case are still active and any future benefits will be added to their card with the same 9-month time limit.

LDOE is continuing to receive inquiries regarding fund expungement.




### **Summer P-EBT**

DCFS is currently working with the USDA to request benefits for Summer 2022 P-EBT. More information will be available if and when plans are approved.

Plans are anticipated to look similar to prior Summer P-EBT benefits

If families received a card for the 2020-21 or 2021-22 school year, they should **not throw the card away** as future benefits will be issued to the same card.




## **Meals Applications and P-EBT**

The school meal application is used to determine eligibility for free or reduced priced meals and, by extension, P-EBT eligibility.

SFAs must make applications available as needed to certify children for free and reduced-priced meals and may be used to qualify newly eligible children for summer 2022 P-EBT benefits

Please be aware that the anticipated deadline for families to apply for free and reduced priced meals to qualify for Summer 2022 P-EBT is <u>July 29, 2022</u>.



# Coming Soon: FY 2022 P-EBT Local Level Funding


In addition to benefits awarded directly to families, USDA has made funding available to all operators of the National School Lunch (NSLP) and National School Breakfast (SBP) responsible for activities related to the <u>FY 2022</u> State Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT).

#### FY 22 P-EBT are all P-EBT activities that:

• Occurred between October 2021 – September 2022 in conjunction to P-EBT benefits issued for school year 2021-2022 and summer 2022.

LDOE will award a specified dollar amount to all eligible entities based on the number of P-EBT eligible children (same process utilized for FY 21 P-EBT Local Level Funding)

\*Eligible program operators <u>will not</u> be required to submit an application to receive the funds More information to come in the next few months.

# **Ancillary CNP Supervisor Certification**

Bulletin 746 was amended to revise Section 703: Ancillary School Certificates for Child Nutrition Program Supervisors

Individuals who are employed as a Child Nutrition Supervisor in Louisiana public school districts and do not currently possess a Child Nutrition Supervisor Ancillary Certificate are required to complete an Ancillary Services Certification Application.

The hiring standards are identical to the hiring standards for directors listed in Federal regulations

The certification is renewable annually with presentation on 12 hours of continuing education as stated in USDA Professional Standards.


### **Summertime Meal Services - OPTIONS**

If an SFA intends to host a summer meals program, there are two options:

- Seamless Summer Option (SSO)
- Summer Food Service Program (SFSP)

## **SFSP Waivers**

- USDA has approved the following waivers for LA SFSP Operations:
  - 1st Week Site Review Waiver
  - Meal Service Time Restrictions Waiver
  - Offer vs Serve Waiver

## **CACFP At-Risk Meals**

- As a reminder, the CACFP At-Risk Program can only operate when school is in session.
- Once the school year ends, the CACFP At-risk Program must end as well.

There is NOT a waiver of the enrichment requirement. Enrichment must be offered.

if meals or snacks are served on weekends or holidays, enrichment must still be offered






## **Keep Kids Fed Act (KKFA)**



# **Keep Kids Fed Act (KKFA)**

The <u>Keep Kids Fed Act of 2022</u>, which President Biden signed into law on June 25, 2022, provides additional support and resources to help Child Nutrition Program operators continue to serve healthy meals to children during this challenging time.


The Act does not extend the broader waiver authority or the resources that would allow USDA to extend the full range of flexibilities currently in place.



# **Keep Kids Fed Act (KKFA)**

#### The Act makes the following changes:

- Extends USDA's authority to issue nationwide waivers that may increase Federal costs for summer meal programs through September 2022.
- For school year (SY) 2022-23, provides temporary additional reimbursements (over the base increase of 7.4%) of:
  - 40 cents per lunch served through the National School Lunch Program (NSLP);
  - 15 cents per breakfast served through the School Breakfast Program (SBP); and
  - 10 cents per meal or snack served in the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP).
- Provides all CACFP family day care homes with the higher "Tier 1" reimbursement rate for SY 2022-23.
- Allows USDA to issue limited nationwide waivers that do not increase Federal costs during the 2022-23 school year.

- Nationwide Waiver to Extend Area Eligibility Waivers for Summer 2022 Operations
- Nationwide Waiver to Allow Area Eligibility for Closed Enrolled Sites for Summer
   2022 Operations
- Nationwide Waiver to Allow Summer Food Service Program Reimbursement Rates for the Seamless Summer Option in Summer 2022



# Nationwide Waiver Update for Summer 2022 Anticipated Waivers

Anticipated additional SFSP/SSO Waivers

- Waiver to Allow Non-Congregate Meal Service in Summer 2022
- Waiver to Allow Parent Guardian Pickup in Summer 2022
- Waiver to Allow Meal Service Time Flexibility in Summer 2022

USDA SWRO is unsure of the exact verbiage of the anticipated Summer waivers. States are advised to wait for release to implement.








# **Nationwide Waiver Update for NSLP/SBP**






## **Possible COVID Specific Instance Waivers**

- Non-Congregate Meal Service
- Parent/Guardian Pick-Up
- Meal Service Times
- Offer versus Serve

These waivers are NOT Nationwide Waivers.



# **Possible COVID Specific Instance Waivers**

These waivers are only to be granted for COVID instances when congregate feeding is limited.

These waivers are intended to be a "safety net" if COVID cases spike over the summer months.

Only approved for short durations of time

Approval will be based on specific criteria related to COVID instances



# Possible COVID Waivers: SFSP/SSO


Non-Congregate Meal Service during Summer 2022

Waives the requirements to serve meals in a congregate setting

Parent and Guardian Meal Pickup during Summer 2022

Waives the requirement that meals may only be served directly to children

Effective through September 30, 2022
Only be implemented when congregate meal service is limited by COVID-19



# Possible COVID Waivers: NSLP/SBP

#### Non-Congregate Meal Service

Waives the requirement that meals must be served in a congregate setting

#### Parent and Guardian Meal Pick Up

Waives the requirement that meals may only be served directly to children


#### **Meal Service Times**

 Waives the requirements that set meal time parameters for school lunch and breakfast

#### Offer versus Serve

 Waives the requirement to serve school lunches to high school students using offer versus serve

Effective until June 30, 2023 but only in instances when congregate service is limited because of COVID



## **Possible COVID Waivers: FFVP**

#### Parent Guardian Pick Up


 Allows SFAs to provide FFVP foods to parents or guardians of children whose elementary school is closed and who are learning virtually

#### Alternate Site

 Allows the SA to approve SFAs participating in FFVP to provide FFVP foods at sites that are not FFVP elementary schools when FFVP elementary schools are closed

Effective July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023

Only to be implemented when congregate meal service is limited because of COVID



# Possible COVID Waivers: Unanticipated School Closures

#### Non-Congregate Meal Service

Waives the requirement that meals must be served in a congregate setting

#### Parent and Guardian Meal Pick Up

Waives the requirement that meals may only be served directly to children

#### **Meal Service Times**

Waives the requirements that set meal time parameters

Service of Meals at School Sites during Unanticipated School Closures

 Waives the requirement that limits the operation of SFSP during an unanticipated school closure to non-school sites

Effective October 1, 2022- April 30, 2023



## **Possible COVID Waivers: CACFP**

#### Non-Congregate Meal Service

Waives the requirement that meals must be served in a congregate setting

#### Parent and Guardian Meal Pick Up

 Waives the requirement that meals may only be served directly to eligible participants


#### **Meal Service Times**

Waives the requirements that set meal time parameters

#### **Onsite Monitoring Requirements**

 Waives the on-site monitoring requirements and allows for monitoring through off-site means

Effective July 1, 2022- June 20, 2023

## **School Year Administration**

#### Local Wellness Policy Triennial Assessment

Provides a new triennial assessment deadline of June 30, 2023, instead of June 30,
 2022


#### Food Service Management Company Contract Duration

 Permits SFAs and SFSP Sponsors to extend existing FSMC contracts that would not otherwise be eligible for extension through June 30, 2023

#### Administrative Review Onsite Requirements

Excludes the onsite monitoring requirements and allows for off-site monitoring processes

Effective through June 30, 2023 and should be used only for the extent and duration needed



## **Additional Flexibilities**

#### Paid Lunch Equity

- Waives the Paid Lunch Equity requirements for SY 2022-2023
- Pertains to the school lunch prices for SY 2022-2023

#### **Carryover Eligibility (NSLP/SBP)**

- Allows schools that operated SSO in ST 2021-2022 to use the most recent free or reduced priced determinations since SY 2019-2020 during the 30-day carryover period of SY 2022-2023.
- Effective for the carryover period of SY 2022-2023

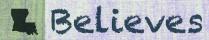


## **Transitional Standards**

- On February 7, 2022, USDA published the Transitional Standards Final Rule.
- This rule provides certainty for the next two school years, while USDA work collaboratively on permanent standards.
- These standards went into effect on July 1, 2022 (this includes SSO operating in July 2022)
- See Memo SFS-22-90 and Memo SFS-22-91 for more information on the Transitional Rule.

## **Key Provisions: Flavored Milk**


- Allows SFAs to offer flavored, low-fat (1 percent) milk at lunch and breakfast and as a beverage for sale a la carte
- Requires that unflavored milk (fat-free or low-fat) be available at each school meal service.
- Extends the transitional milk requirements to the Special Milk Program for Children and to the Child and Adult Care Food Program for children ages six and older and adult participants.
- This rule also clarifies that lactose free and reduced-lactose fluid milk meet the Special Milk Program for Children and the Child and Adult Care Food Program requirements for fluid milk to provide consistency across all Child Nutrition Programs.



## **Key Provisions: Whole Grains**

- Requires that at least 80 percent of the weekly grains in the NSLP and SBP be whole grain rich
- The remaining 20 percent weekly grains offered must be enriched

\*Whole grain-rich products are those grain products with at least 50 percent whole grains and the remaining grains, if any, are enriched.



#### **Key Provisions: Sodium**

- Retains Sodium Target 1 for NSLP and SBP through SY 2022-2023.
- Retains Sodium Target 1 for SBP in SY 2023-2024
- Institutes a Sodium Interim Target 1A for NSLP for SY 2023-2024




#### **Direct Certification with Medicaid**

n December 14, the USDA announced that Louisiana is one of eight states selected to participate in the expansion of a demonstration project to evaluate the impact of using Medicaid eligibility data to directly certify students for free and reduced-price school meals, beginning in **school year 2022-2023**.

Under the demonstrations, State agencies match school enrollment data with Medicaid eligibility data to identify children who receive Medicaid, or live with a child who receives Medicaid, and whose family income, before expenses and deductions, does not exceed:

- 130 percent of the Federal Poverty Level for free school meal eligibility; or
- 185 percent of the Federal Poverty Level for reduced price meal eligibility



## **Louisiana Medicaid Matching Process**

The Matching Process for Medicaid-Free and Medicaid Reduced will be the same as used currently for SNAP and TANF

Medicaid Free and Medicaid reduced will be two separate matching choices. Two files will be available for download, one for Medicaid-free and one for Medicaid-reduced



#### 2022-2023 eScholar Enhancements


DM-Index and 3.0 file formats will be available

- Medicaid Free file format available in August 2022
- Medicaid Reduced file format available in August 2022

The file formats will be similar to SNAP and TANF.

LDOE has been in contact with the food service software vendors to ensure a smooth transition with adding these two files for SY 2022-2023.

# Reduced Priced Children Determined Through Medicaid

Due to differences in household definition and income assessments between programs, some children directly certified for reduced-price meals through Medicaid may have been eligible for free meals if the household applied.

The USDA requires that these households receive notice of the income level used and be offered the opportunity to apply if their income, based on National School Lunch Program (NSLP) eligibility policies, is within the limit for free meals (using the NSLP's current income eligibility guidelines).



## **Direct Certification using Handwritten Case Numbers**

Under the Medicaid demonstration, children are not considered to be categorically eligible and may be directly certified only via an automated data matching process with the Medicaid eligibility records.


Therefore, households are not allowed to handwrite their Medicaid case number on the application or provide "proof" of Medicaid in order for their child to be eligible for free or reduced-price meals.




## **Negative Impact and Medicaid Determination**

Students already certified for free or reduced-price meals based on an application or direct certification with another program cannot be negatively impacted by the match with Medicaid data.

If a local educational agency (LEA) has determined that a child is directly certified as reduced-price eligible through Medicaid, and the child is determined to be directly certified through SNAP, TANF or FDPIR or identified as homeless, a runaway, enrolled in a federally funded Head Start Program, or is a foster child; the LEA's determination supersedes the Medicaid reduced-price status.






#### eScholar Direct Match


#### **Reminder: Procurement**

#### **FSMC Contracts**


The deadline for Charter Schools to submit their Food Service Management Company Contract or Agreement Amendment was June 1, 2022.

Contracts and contract amendment will be approved as of the date they are approved by the State Agency.

All FSMC contracts for the 2021-22 School Year end on June 30, 2022.

If your SFA is operating the Summer Food Service Program during the month of July 2022, meals may not be claimed for the days you do not have an approved FSMC contract.




#### **USDA Civil Rights Updates**

- On May 5, 2022, the USDA FNS Civil Rights Division, issued a memorandum on Bostock v. Clayton County and its application to USDA FNS Programs.
- Clarifies that the prohibition of discrimination based on sex includes gender identity and sexual orientation.
- The changes impact the USDA Nondiscrimination Statement (NDS) and the And Justice for All (AJFA) posters.

As a reminder, CNPs prohibit the separation by gender in the meal service. See <a href="Memo">Memo</a> <a href="SFS-15-77">SFS-15-77</a> for more information



#### **NDS** and AJFA Updated Guidance

#### **Nondiscrimination Statement**

- All documents, pamphlets, websites, etc. should be updated with the 2022 NDS as follows
  - Websites must be updated within 90 days of the date of this memorandum.
  - Documents, pamphlets, brochures, etc., using 2015 NDS language must be updated when current supply on hand is exhausted or by September 30, 2023.
  - All new printing must use the 2022 NDS.

#### **And Justice for All Posters**

- Until the new posters are received
  - AJFA posters currently posted must not be removed until replaced with the new poster.
  - The 2019 AJFA poster(s) language should be updated on websites, training presentations and any pending printing of brochures, pamphlets and materials and replaced with the appropriate 2022 version.




## Coming Soon: Additional Supply Chain Assistance Funds

Additional Supply Chain Assistance Funds announced by USDA

Funds will be distributed by state agencies to schools across the country, so they can purchase domestically grown foods for their meal programs.

This assistance builds on the \$1 billion in supply chain assistance funds USDA previously allocated in December 2021, which states can use this school year and next school year to provide schools with funding for commodity purchases, according to the release.



## **Coming Soon: Updated Free/Reduced Forms**

No major changes to the free and reduced forms for SY 2022-23 Updates include:

- Change in School Year
- Updated non-discrimination statement
- New Eligibility Determination letter for Medicaid



#### No Universal Free Meals in SY 2022-2023

The federal government allowed schools to offer free meals to all students during the pandemic, but Congress did not extend this benefit for next school year.

Families that are eligible for free or reduced-price meals must apply to receive them, and all other students must pay full price for their meals (unless a CEP school)

The school year begins on July 1. Schools can begin to accept application for free and reduced-price meals for SY 2022-2023 now.

Schools are encourage to provide frequent, easy to understand messages to families to encourage the completion of meal applications.
