



# Verification

- Verification Summary Report:

- SFAs that participate in District-wide CEP are not required to accept applications and/or complete the verification process, but must complete the Verification Summary Form.

## WHEN IS VERIFICATION COMPLETE?

1. The household submits adequate written evidence that results in no change in status: **considered complete for this household.**
2. The household submits adequate written evidence which indicates that the children should receive either a greater or lesser level of benefits: **considered complete for this household when the notice of adverse action is sent OR household is notified that its benefits will be increased or decreased.**
3. The household indicates, verbally or in writing, that it no longer wishes to receive free or reduced price benefits: **considered complete when the notice of adverse action is sent.**
4. The application provided case numbers and it is determined that no household member is receiving benefits from an Assistance Program: **considered complete when the notice of adverse action is sent.**





- Additional Funding was Awarded for the 2022 NSLP Equipment Grant
- An Embargo on the Goals and Funding Amounts Distributed to States by USDA Resulted in Delays to Opening the Online Application to SFAs
- The Agreement with USDA for Funding has Been Approved as Follows:
  - \$521,423 from the Consolidated Appropriations Act
  - \$860,586 from the American Rescue Plan Act (Additional Funding)

## **Pandemic Electronic Benefits Transfer (P-EBT) and Local Level Funding**

## Summer 2022 P-EBT

- All students in K-12 schools were eligible if they received free or reduced-priced meals and were in school in May 2022.
- Eligible children will receive a total payment of \$391 to cover June and July. Payments will be issued in two installments.
  - First payment: \$195
  - Second payment: \$196
- Benefits were issued beginning in late summer and into the autumn months and will be issued on the same card that was received for the 2020-21 or 2021-22 school year.

# Summer 2022 P-EBT Benefits

## Eligibility Requirements

- Students attended school at least 1 day in May 2022.
- Students whose school they attended in May, participated in CEP in SY 21-22 or qualified for free/reduced price meals under the NSLP/SBP. This includes:
  - Students who received P-EBT benefits during May 2021 including those who graduated.
  - Students who were eligible for free or reduced price school meals under the NSLP or SBP in SY 21-22 or attended a CEP school in May.
- Children who are determined newly eligible for free or reduced priced meals, including those who submitted free/reduced price lunch applications by COB Friday, July 29, 2022.

## P-EBT Fund Expungement

All federal benefits issued (including P-EBT) by DCFS have a 9-month time limit for use. The timer is reset to 9 months each time a purchase is made.

Families were sent letters to inform recipients that they have benefits that will soon expire. If they make a purchase, the timer will be reset. If they don't, any remaining benefits will be lost.

However, the card and the case are still active and any future benefits will be added to their card with the same 9-month time limit.

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## Coming Soon: FY 2022 P-EBT Local Level Funding

In addition to benefits awarded directly to families, USDA has made funding available to all operators of the National School Lunch (NSLP) and National School Breakfast (SBP) responsible for activities related to the FY 2022 State Pandemic Electronic Benefit Transfer (P-EBT).

FY 22 P-EBT are all P-EBT activities that:

- Occurred between October 2021 – September 2022 in conjunction to P-EBT benefits issued for school year 2021-2022 and summer 2022.

LDOE will award a specified dollar amount to all eligible entities based on the number of P-EBT eligible children (same process utilized for FY 21 P-EBT Local Level Funding)

\*Eligible program operators will not be required to submit an application to receive the funds

# Nationwide Waiver Updates for SY 2022-2023

- Fiscal Action Flexibility for Meal Pattern Violations Related to COVID-19 Supply Chain Disruptions Impacting School Meals in SY 2022-2023
- This waiver applies to the NSLP, SBP, and SSO and is available for any state where there is a supply chain disruption due to COVID-19.
- When determining whether this waiver is applicable during an administrative review, State agencies consider all of the information SFAs have available that illustrates that a COVID-19 supply chain disruption occurred. This waiver is available through June 30, 2023.

## Additional Flexibilities for SY 2022-2023

### Paid Lunch Equity

- Waives the Paid Lunch Equity requirements for SY 2022-2023
- Pertains to the school lunch prices for SY 2022-2023

### Carryover Eligibility (NSLP/SBP)

- **Allows schools that operated SSO in SY 2021-2022 to use the most recent free or reduced priced determinations since SY 2019-2020 during the 30-day carryover period of SY 2022-2023.**
- **Effective for the carryover period of SY 2022-2023**

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## **Transitional Standards on Milk, Whole Grains and Sodium Final Rule**

# Transitional Meal Pattern Standards

## SUMMARY OF CHANGES



### MILK

Schools and child care providers may offer flavored, low-fat milk (1%) in addition to unflavored, low-fat milk and flavored or unflavored nonfat milk<sup>1</sup>.



### SODIUM

The weekly sodium limit for school lunch and breakfast will remain at the current level, known as Target 1, for school year 2022-2023. For school lunch only, the limit will decrease marginally (10%) in school year 2023-2024 to put schools on an achievable path toward long-term sodium reduction, which will be addressed in future rulemaking.



### WHOLE GRAINS


At least 80% of the grains served in school lunch and breakfast per week must be whole grain-rich (containing at least 50% whole grains).

# Whole Grains

- The [Whole Grain Resource for the National School Lunch and School](#) has been revised with the 2022 final rule for Child Nutrition Programs for Transitional Meal Standards
- Provides examples of various grain products often served in schools and walks the user through the process of determining whether products are whole grain-rich, creditable as enriched, or not creditable



## Buy American Provision: Lettuce Shortage

- Buy American Provisions are required when purchasing fresh and processed agricultural products
- Shortage of domestically grown lettuce: particularly romaine and iceberg lettuce
- If lettuce shortage affects ability to purchase domestically:
  - Distributor or Food Service Management Company must request an exception and received approval from the SFA to use a non-domestic product at least **14 days** in advance of delivery
  - This can be accomplished by submitting a Buy American Certification Form for the domestic product that is not available.

# Medicaid Demonstration Project 2022-2023

## Direct Certification with Medicaid

Louisiana is one of eight states selected to participate in a demonstration project to evaluate the impact of using Medicaid eligibility data to directly certify students for free and reduced-price school meals, that began this school year and continues throughout School Year 2022-2023.

State agencies match school enrollment data with Medicaid eligibility data to identify children who receive Medicaid, or live with a child who receives Medicaid, and whose family income, before expenses and deductions, does not exceed:

- 130 percent of the Federal Poverty Level for free school meal eligibility; or
- 185 percent of the Federal Poverty Level for reduced price meal eligibility

**Please note: not all children receiving Medicaid will receive free or reduced meals.**

## Reduced Priced Children Determined Through Medicaid

Due to differences in household definition and income assessments between programs, some children directly certified for reduced-price meals through Medicaid may have been eligible for free meals if the household applied.

The USDA requires that these households receive notice of the income level used and be offered the opportunity to apply if their income, based on National School Lunch Program (NSLP) eligibility policies, is within the limit for free meals (using the NSLP's current income eligibility guidelines).


## Direct Certification using Handwritten Case Numbers

Under the Medicaid demonstration, children are not considered to be categorically eligible and may be directly certified only via an automated data matching process with the Medicaid eligibility records.

Therefore, households are not allowed to handwrite their Medicaid case number on the application or provide “proof” of Medicaid in order for their child to be eligible for free or reduced-price meals.

## Reduced Medicaid Determination: Negative Impact and Extending to Household Siblings

- Students May Not Be Negatively Impacted / Receive Lower Level Benefits Based on Medicaid Match
- If a Student is Matched as Reduced through the Medicaid Determination and they Match as Free through Another Means, the Free Status Remains. For example:
  - Directly Certified Students through SNAP/TANF/FDPIR Remain Free
  - Students Qualifying through a List for Homeless/Migrant/Runaway Status Remain Free
  - Students Qualifying through Foster Care Remain Free
  - Students Qualifying as Free through and Income Application Remain Free
- Medicaid Free and Medicaid Reduced: Extend Benefits to Siblings in the Same Household Whenever it Improves Individual Student Benefits



## **Supply Chain Assistance Funds: Second and Third Allocation**

## Second Allocation: Supply Chain Assistance (SCA) Funds

- Second Allocation Supply Chain Assistance (SCA) Funds Issued to CNPs on October 3, 2022, Based on Enrollment
- This assistance builds on the \$1 billion in supply chain assistance funds USDA previously allocated in December 2021
- Purpose:
  - Enhance School District Ability to Purchase Foods for School Meals in Light of Supply Chain Challenges
  - May be Used to Purchase Unprocessed and Minimally Processed Domestic Food

## Second Allocation SCA Funds

- Payment Amounts are Included in [Memo SFS-23-004](#)
- For Tracking and Audit Purposes, the SCA Payment Reference and CFDA Number follows:
  - “FY23 SCA” with Header Text “FNS Supply Chain Assistance”
  - CFDA Number “NSLP-10.555”
- SFAs Must Maintain Documentation Supporting Food Purchases that are allowable for SCA purposes
- SCA funds deposited to the NPFSA do not need to be separated from other monies within the account and are not tracked separately from an accounting standpoint. The CFDA number is the same as the program CFDA number (NSLP-10.555)

## Coming Soon: Third Allocation of Supply Chain Assistance Funds

Because the underlying conditions fueling supply chain disruptions and other economic uncertainty remain significant in many parts of the country, FNS is providing an additional \$471.5 million in SCA funds

State agencies will distribute this third round of SCA funding to eligible School Food Authorities (SFAs) via the same formula used to distribute the first and second rounds of funds.

Much like the Second Allocation of SCA funds, these funds remain limited to the purchase of unprocessed or minimally processed domestic food products.

## Procurement Regulations and SFA Procurement Plan for SY 2022-2023

- Please ensure that all state procurement laws and regulations are followed

## Small Purchase and Micro-purchase Thresholds

- On May 31, 2022, Governor John Bel Edwards signed House Bill 221 (Act 204) into law.
  - Increases the micro-purchase threshold from **\$10,000 to \$30,000**
  - Increases the small purchase threshold from **\$30,000 to \$60,000**
- Normal purchasing guidelines regarding quotes with small purchases still apply
- Effective date: August 1, 2022

## Memo SFS-23-008 Charter Schools Using FSMCs

- Food Service Management Companies: Charges Outside of Allowable Expenses
- CNP Food Service Management Company Contracts are Limited to a Meal Times Rate Contract
- Refer to Section 1 – Scope and Purpose of the Prototype FSMC, Item FF
  - “The charge to the SFA/Sponsor for FSMC’s fee is to be clearly identified in the proposal. Fees imposed by a FSMC outside of this contract may not be paid for with Child Nutrition Funds”.
- Refer to the Proposal Summary and Agreement signed by the FSMC that states:
  - “...The offeror also understands that the FSMC cannot charge any fees other than the meal cost as indicated above for the number of meals served. The FSMC will not charge late fees, charge for meals delivered, etc.”
