Current EOP By School Type




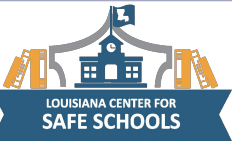

Updates from LCSS

- **Purchased and dispersing bleed kits as schools complete the required trainings.**
 - Kits exceed the required components in the Principals Handbook from the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE).
 - 3 and 6 pack kits were allocated per student population (LHSAA high school class sizes converted for middle & elementary schools).
 - Three tourniquet types (SWAT-T, TMT, and CAT-T) also based on student populations and average or typical student body types and sizes.
- **LCSS renewed the emergency notification system for teachers and anonymous reporting system for students contracts.**
 - Emergency Notification – roughly 83% of all schools are compliant.
 - Anonymous Reporting – active in 600 schools, new total campuses Oct.1



LCSS Update continued

US Secret Service to provide Threat Assessment trainings through the National Threat Assessment Center yielding Train-the-Trainer certifications for local Sheriff's/Deputies and School Resource Officers.

- 3 trainings with up to 100 participants each (Lafayette, New Orleans, Shreveport).
- Provides resiliency for School Safety Assessments and EOP planning engagement.
 - Sheriff's Association (LSA)
 - Police Chiefs Association
 - Louisiana Commission for Law Enforcement (LCLE)
 - Peace Officer Standards & Training (POST) Council
 - Association of School Resource Officers (LASRO) support
 - Louisiana Drug Abuse Resistance Education (DARE) Officers



LCSS Updates continued

- **Data Call Questionnaire (School Safety Survey) 2025 for school safety reporting**
 - Planning for additional data questions and submission of attachments
 - Full participation is needed for accurate operating data to apply for federal grants in Spring of 2025.
 - Tentative launch in January & close prior to FY25 Federal and LCSS grant openings.
- **Planning for 4th Annual School Safety Summit will begin soon**
 - Structured engagement providing certification for forthcoming missions
 - Medical Emergency Planning – Cardiac Plans, AED & Stop-the-Bleed trainings, District Threat Assessment Teams, and other legislative required components.



DHS CISA System-based Approach

Taking a **systems-based approach** to school physical security means ensuring that various security measures across a school campus work together in an integrated way, and that planning also incorporates the relevant policies and training programs that must also be in place for the entire system to function effectively.

The Systems-Based Approach At-A-Glance:

- Understand the five core elements of school physical security
- Consider a school's specific circumstances to tailor measures
- Identify the various security layers that exist at the school
- Determine security efforts in alignment with P-PM-RR
- Engage in the school security physical planning process

2.2 | THE SCHOOL SECURITY PHYSICAL SYSTEM: STRATEGIES AND ELEMENTS

After taking this brief's eye view of a school's physical security system from the perspective of the broader school safety system, this section provides an overview of the physical security system. It begins by defining the physical security system and then discusses the physical security strategies and elements that contribute to the system. This section also provides a table of physical security strategies and provides examples of measures that contribute to achieving them.

Physical Security Strategy	Measure Definition	Examples
Detection	What are the detection capabilities of the school's physical security system?	Video surveillance, intrusion detection, door and window sensors, etc.
Delay	What are the delay capabilities of the school's physical security system?	Security doors, bullet-resistant windows, etc.
Response	What are the response capabilities of the school's physical security system?	Security personnel, law enforcement, etc.

FIGURE 2.4 - STEPS IN THE SCHOOL SECURITY PHYSICAL PLANNING PROCESS

STEP 1. FORM A PHYSICAL SECURITY PLANNING TEAM
 Identify and include relevant school staff and stakeholders, such as community organizations, local law enforcement, and families.

STEP 2. GATHER RELEVANT LOCAL DATA
 Gather local data about safety incidents at schools and the consequences of such events.

STEP 3. THREAT ANALYSIS
 What types of safety incidents are a concern for a school, and how likely are they to occur?

STEP 4. VULNERABILITY ANALYSIS
 What safety and security measures are already in place at the school?

STEP 5. RISK ANALYSIS
 What are the potential consequences of each of the identified safety incidents based on the security measures in place at the school? How do security measures reduce risk? What risk remains?

STEP 6. CREATE A SECURITY PLAN
 Which of those remaining risks are a concern, and what are the most practical and effective additional safety and security measures to address them?

ACT 421 of the 2024 legislative session now requires all student athletes and their parents to be provided information on Sudden Cardiac Emergencies and Cardiac Health.

Cardiac Health Information and the Cardiac Health Information Signature Page for parents/guardians of student athletes is now available on the Safe and Healthy Schools webpage.

AED Registration Reminder

[R.S. 40:1137.3](#) was updated in 2023 and now requires AEDs on site at ALL school campuses. The Bureau of Emergency Management Services (BEMS) has emailed schools to register AEDs with the Bureau.

Registration of AEDs is required and is available through BEMS for devices not yet registered.
