# Title I Excess Funds Waiver

**The Title I Excess Funds Waiver application is open in eGMS now.**

- Completion and approval of the 6/30 and 9/30 PERs (due 11/15/25) are imperative to the correct determination of the amount of Title I excess funds.
- Please ensure both the 6/30 and 9/30 PERs are complete and capture all expenditures.
- Each LEA is allowed one Title I Excess Funds Waiver every three years. Louisiana was approved for a waiver, so your district request for a Title I excess funds carryover waiver this year will not affect your ability to request another, if needed, over the next three years.
- The Title I Excess Funds Waiver application can be found under “Non Funded”.
- School Systems that fail to complete these waiver protocols run the risk of Title I excess funds being removed from their Title I budgets.

# Equitable Services Updates and Reminders

- It is time to conduct your equitable services outreach to see if you have any new nonpublic schools in your attendance zone.
- Though a nonpublic school may be approved by the LA State Department's BESE Board, only non-profit schools may participate.
- Reach out to your community contacts, churches, check local newspapers, magazines, restaurants.
- Call and introduce yourself and share highlights of your LEA's nonpublic program.
- Share the State Nonpublic contact information: **nonpublicschools@la.gov** to get more information about obtaining BESE approval.

# Equitable Services Updates and Reminders

- Send Intent to Participate letters to currently participating nonpublic schools; ensure they include their tax ID/IRS number.
- Once the State Nonpublic Office approves the 2026-2027 Nonpublic Schools Academic Classification list, contact any new schools in your district.
- Expedite the process by collecting documentation from current participating schools now.
- This is the time to set up budget meetings and review the Needs Assessments.
- Email the State Ombudsman about nonpublic schools that have not used or obligated any of their Titles II and IV allocations.

# Equitable Services Updates and Reminders

- Time for site visits, consultations, and budget meetings regarding your Titles I, II , III, and IV equitable services programs with your Title I teachers/tutors/interventionist and/or 3rd party companies/consultants.
- Be sure to update your principals, superintendents, CEO's, headmasters, etc. on the programs, and get their input.
- Always remember, even though the consultants, 3rd parties, and LEA personnel work with the nonpublic schools, they are hired by the LEA to provide the services.
- Therefore, their first line of communication should always be with the LEA, who is the fiscal and program manager.

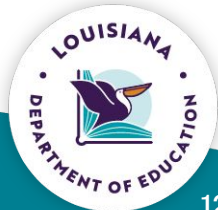
# Equitable Services Updates and Reminders

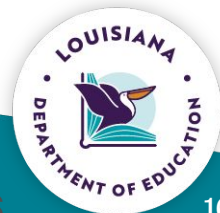


# McKinney Vento Homeless Assistance Act

Students that lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence:

- Sharing housing due to economic hardship
- Living in hotels, motels, trailer parks, camping grounds
- Nighttime residence is a public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings
- Living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations
- Migratory children

McKinney Vento Law: Ensure students experiencing homelessness are able to **attend** school, **access** necessary resources, and be **successful**.



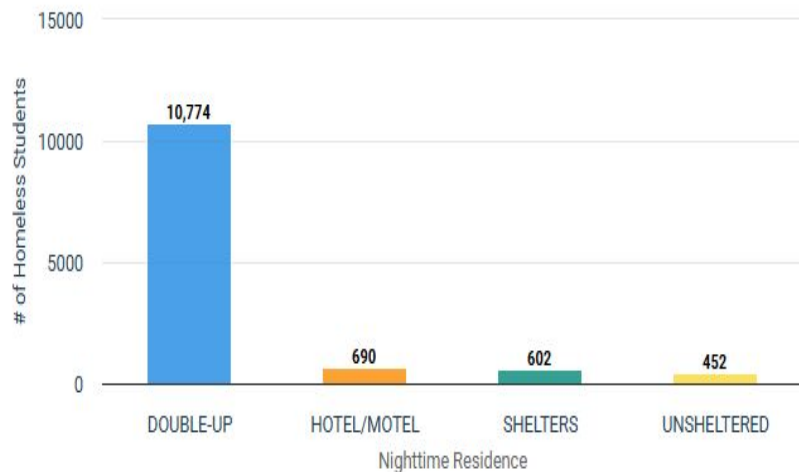


# Louisiana's Homeless Data

What is the Night Time Residence of our Homeless Students?



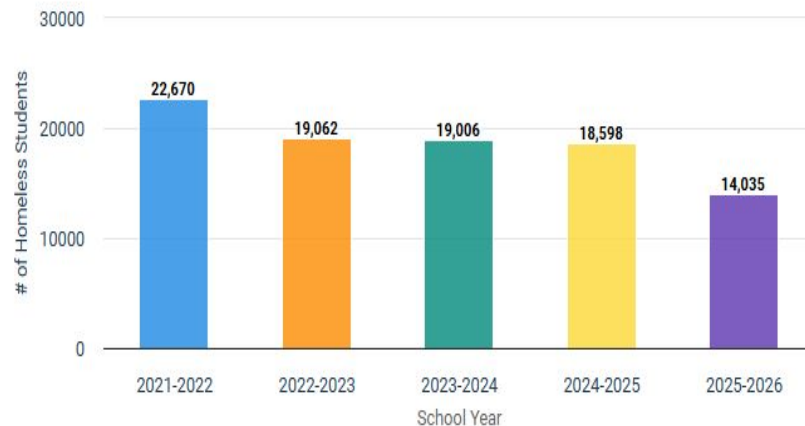
The number of currently enrolled homeless students by nighttime residence.

The number of homeless students each year.

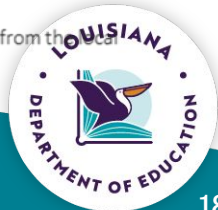

# The Role of Homeless Liaison

DUTIES- Each local educational agency liaison for homeless children and youths, designated under paragraph (1)(J)(ii), shall ensure that—

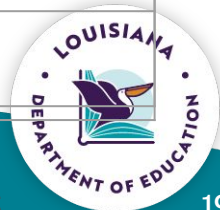
- (i) homeless children and youths **are identified** by school personnel through outreach and coordination activities with other entities and agencies;
- (ii) homeless children and youths **are enrolled in, and have a full and equal opportunity to succeed in**, schools of that local educational agency;
- (iii) homeless families and homeless children and youths **have access to and receive educational services** for which such families, children, and youths are eligible, including services through Head Start programs (including Early Head Start programs) under the Head Start Act (42 U.S.C. 9831 et seq.), early intervention services under part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. 1431 et seq.), and other preschool programs administered by the local educational agency;
- (iv) homeless families and homeless children and youths **receive referrals** to health care services, dental services, mental health and substance abuse services, housing services, and other appropriate services;
- (v) **the parents or guardians of homeless children and youths are informed** of the educational and related opportunities available to their children and are provided with meaningful opportunities to participate in the education of their children;
- (vi) **public notice of the educational rights** of homeless children and youths is disseminated in locations frequented by parents or guardians of such children and youths, and unaccompanied youths, including schools, shelters, public libraries, and soup kitchens, in a manner and form understandable to the parents and guardians of homeless children and youths, and unaccompanied youths;
- (vii) **enrollment disputes** are mediated in accordance with paragraph (3)(E);
- (viii) the parent or guardian of a homeless child or youth, and any unaccompanied youth, **is fully informed of all transportation services** including transportation to the school of origin, as described in paragraph (1)(J)(iii), and is assisted in accessing transportation to the school that is selected under paragraph (3)(A).
- (ix) school personnel providing services under this subtitle receive **professional development** and other support; and
- (x) unaccompanied youths—
  - (I) are enrolled in school;
  - (II) have opportunities to meet the same challenging State academic standards as the State establishes for other children and youth, including through implementation of the procedures under paragraph (1)(F)(ii); and
  - (III) are informed of their status as independent students under section 480 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 1087vv) and that the youths may obtain assistance from the local educational agency liaison to receive verification of such status for purposes of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid described in section 483 of such Act (20 U.S.C. 1090).

# Allowable Uses of Funds

## McKinney Vento Authorized Activities 42 U.S.C. 11433(d)

- 1) tutoring, supplemental instruction, and enriched educational service
- 2) expedited evaluations of the strengths and needs of homeless children and youths,
- 3) Professional development and other activities for educators and specialized instructional support personnel that are designed to heighten the understanding and sensitivity
- 4) Referral services to homeless children and youths for medical, dental, mental, and other health services.
- 5) assistance to defray the excess cost of transportation
- 6) developmentally appropriate early childhood education programs, not otherwise provided through Federal, State, or local funding, for preschool-aged homeless children
- 7) services and assistance to attract, engage, and retain homeless children and youths, particularly homeless children and youths who are not enrolled in school
- 8) before- and after-school, mentoring, and summer programs
- 9) the payment of fees and other costs associated with tracking, obtaining, and transferring records necessary to enroll homeless children and youths in school

# Allowable Uses of Funds

10) education and training to the parents and guardians of homeless children and youths about the rights of, and resources available

11) development of coordination between schools and agencies providing services to homeless children and youths

12) provision of specialized instructional support services (including violence prevention counseling) and referrals for such services

13) Activities to address the particular needs of homeless children and youths that may arise from domestic violence and parental mental health or substance abuse problems.

14) The adaptation of space and purchase of supplies for any non-school facilities

15) The provision of school supplies, including those supplies to be distributed at shelters or temporary housing facilities, or other appropriate locations.

16) other extraordinary or emergency assistance needed to enable homeless children and youths to attend school and participate fully in school activities

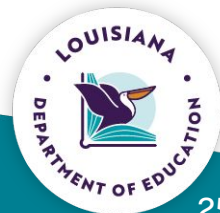

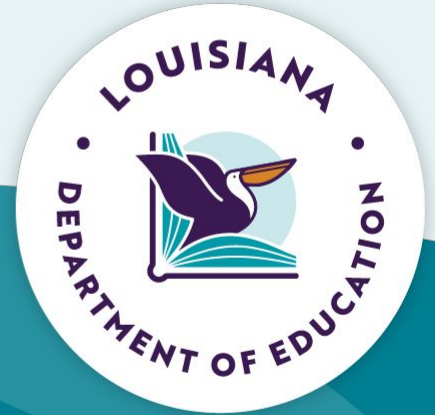

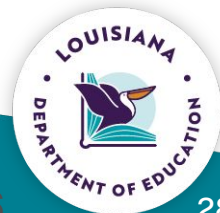

The LDOE annually analyzes special education data and reports outcomes as part of the IDEA Part B State Performance Plan (SPP) in the Annual Performance Report (APR).

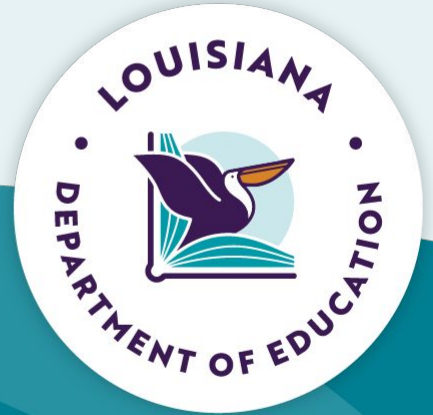
- **Data Release:** APR results were made available via the Data Management File Transfer Portal (DM FTP) the week of **December 8, 2025**.

- **Corrective Action:** School systems identified as non-compliant on any targeted indicators must submit a **Plan of Correction** to the LDOE by **January 15, 2026**.

Please review your results promptly and submit any required corrective actions or self-assessment results to the designated APR point of contact.

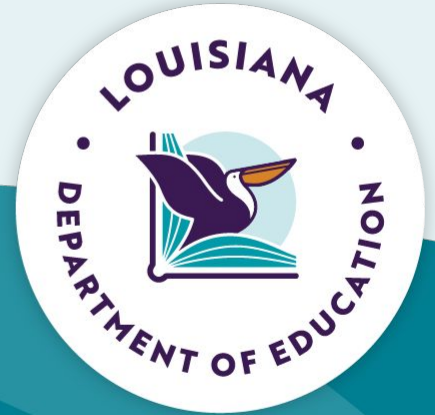

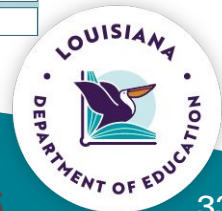
- The Fiscal Monitoring tab for December 2025 in the Title II and IV Equitable Share application is now available.

- All Fiscal Monitoring data must be submitted on or before, January 30, 2026.



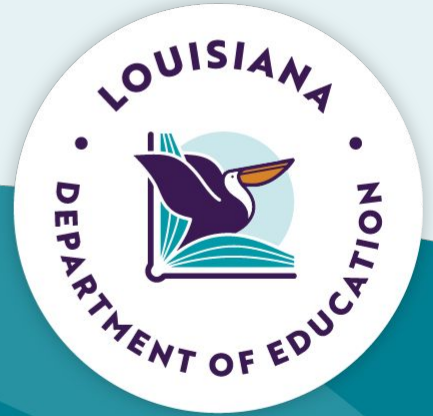

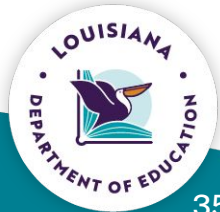
