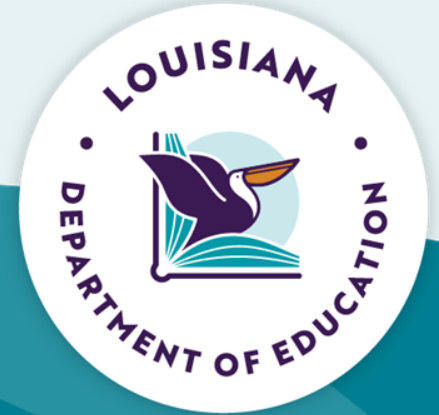

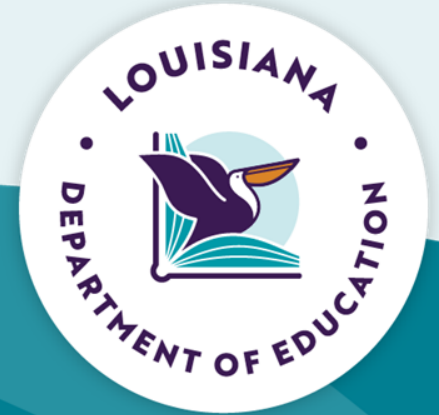

Equitable Services Updates and Reminders

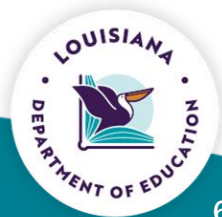
- Conduct meaningful consultation with nonpublic leaders regarding your LEA Nonpublic Title I Program
- Schedule meetings with 3rd party providers, vendors and consultants.
- Clarify that you are their main contact regarding any federal program services to nonpublic schools.
- Incorporate monthly, quarterly and as needed consultations with 3rd party companies, vendors and consultants as needed.

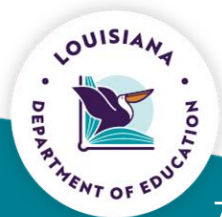
- For your SEA Titles II and IV fiscal documentation:
 - fiscal/financial reports are allowable however, be sure to upload the company, vendor or consultant, invoices/purchase orders, etc. which identifies the items/services purchased.

Equitable Services Updates and Reminders

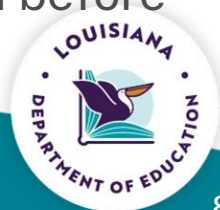
- LEAs may have Nonpublic Title I Tutorial teachers/interventionist start working 2 week prior to school to assist with Title I room preparation, setting up technology, loading programs and preparing parent approval forms, LEA Parent and Family Engagement documentation, scheduling tutoring sessions and checking to see if any new nonpublic students qualify for services.
- Conduct beginning of the year inventory and check invoices for new materials, supplies, equipment, etc.

Equitable Services Updates and Reminders

- For LEAs that will have an approved Title IV Waiver remember:
 - this applies to the nonpublic schools services as well
 - nonpublic schools do not have to adhere to the percentage rules
 - nonpublic schools may still have the services requested for well - rounded, safe and healthy and technology
- Additional information will be provided after participating LEAs have been approved.
- The transfer consultation with the nonpublic schools is still required before the LEA may transfer any funds.

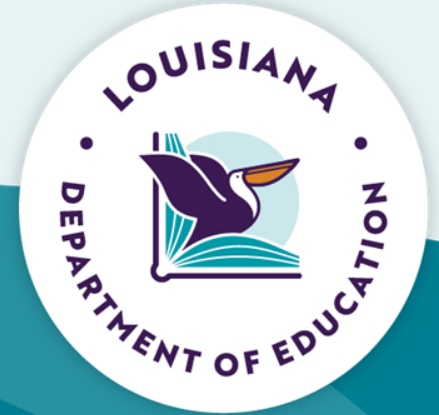

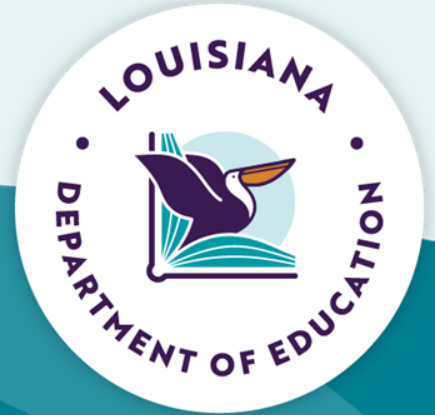

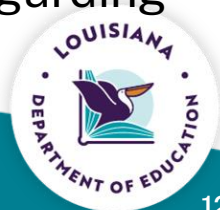


FY24 ESEA Tydings Waiver



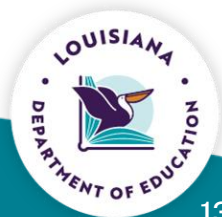
FY24 ESEA Tydings Waiver - Public Comment

- Louisiana is requesting these waivers because it is not possible to obligate funds on a timely basis as originally planned, due to the state's continued commitment to address student instructional interruptions in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Instructional loss presented unique student learning challenges, thereby increasing the need to provide evidence-based instructional strategies to support learning loss and to provide educators with targeted professional development. This waiver will provide continued support to the statewide instructional focus areas that include literacy, STEM, and college and career readiness activities. The state has already witnessed continued positive gains regarding student learning loss recovery efforts.

2027 Super App - Next Steps

- 2027 Super App Amendment 1 should have been submitted on or before June 30, 2026. If you have not yet submitted, please do so as soon as possible.
- Submitted applications are currently in the review process. If an application is “returned for change”, all corrections should be made, and the application submitted within 3-5 business days
- August 2026
 - Preliminary allocations will be loaded
 - 2027 Indirect Cost Rates will be included in the system
 - An amendment will be needed to account for any change in funding due to preliminary allocations

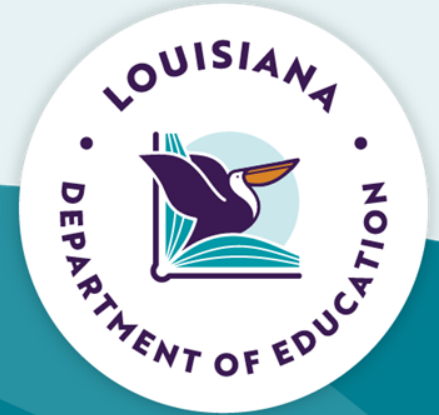
2025 SEA TII and TIV Equitable Services

- The 2025 SEA TII and TIV Equitable Services application was opened on Monday, June 22, 2026 for amendment create/submit.
- Fiscal Reporting for June 30, 2026 needs to be completed.
- Deadline for submission of the June 30 Fiscal Reporting was **July 15, 2026**.
- Keep in mind, you will need to
 - insert amounts expended between 1/1/26 and 6/30/26;
 - include a list of expenditures with respective amounts for this time period; and
 - upload supporting documentation for the expenditures identified for this time period.

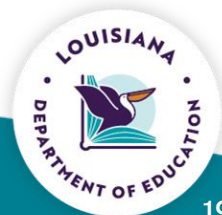

2026 Federal Interest Application

The Notice of Federal Interest (NFI) reporting requirement (2 CFR § 200.330):

- Must report annually, for at least the first 15 years, on the status of the real property in which the federal government has made a monetary investment and therefore has an ongoing interest.
- These requirements:
 - ensure a facility can continue to be used for educational purposes after a grant has ended;
 - establish the level of public investment in the facility that may be recouped if the property is subsequently transferred to private ownership; and
 - promote nondiscrimination, including accessibility, while the property is used for a grant's educational purpose.

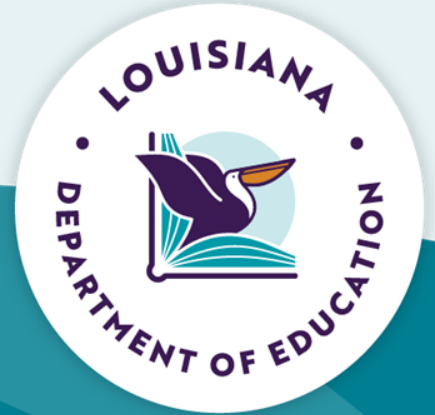


2026 Federal Interest Application

- All grantees/subgrantees that have a renovation, major remodeling, construction, or real property project of \$1 million or more in funds from these programs must record all NFIs.
- The State Educational Agency (SEA) must annually collect the following from the local educational agencies (LEAs):
 - Real Property Status Report (Cover Page) (SF-429); and
 - Other applicable Standard Form 429 Attachment (A or C).
- These forms must be submitted to the SEA other grantee by their deadline (and annually after the end of the grant).
- **Submission Deadline: August 3, 2026**



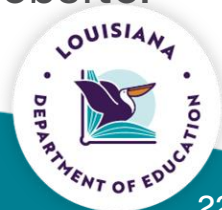

Updated LA Student Residency Form and Referral Form

During the last legislative session, [Act 628 \(2026\)](#) was passed which requires the LDOE to add food insecurity questions to the residency questionnaire that LEAs already administer for McKinney-Vento student identification.

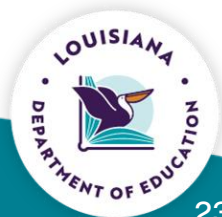
Before students return this fall, please ensure that your LEA is ready to distribute the updated questionnaire to every K-12 student at enrollment, at any change of address, and whenever school staff or a school-based health clinic has reasonable suspicion of food insecurity to connect any student flagged as at-risk (or their parent/guardian) [with the LDH-compiled resource information](#). The revised [Questionnaire](#) and [Referral Form](#) are also available on the website.



Updated LA Student Residency Form and Referral Form

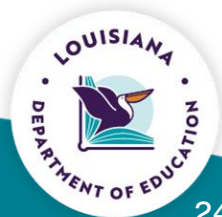
Districts should identify who (e.g., your McKinney-Vento liaison, school counselor, etc.) will receive and act on flagged responses by building a process into enrollment and address-change procedures ahead of the new school year.

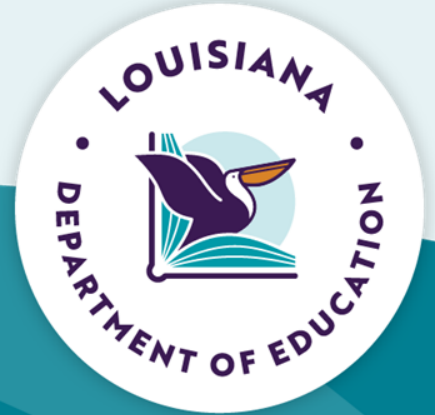


Next Steps For Liaisons

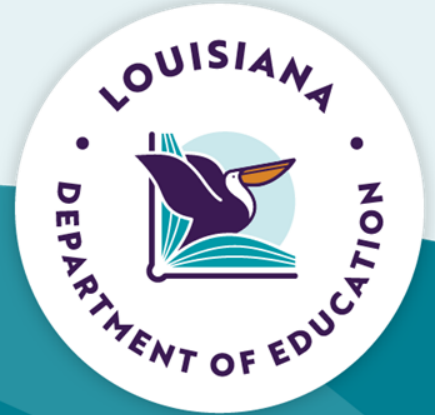
- 1) Replace the old residency and referral forms with the new forms
- 2) If the parent answers yes to the food insecurity questions, provide them with the link of LDH resources.
- 3) If the family flags as McKinney Vento, process as usual.
- 4) Please get with your Superintendent/Federal Program Director to identify the POC for families that are flagged **only** as experiencing food insecurity. Please submit the name and email address of that person on the [contact form](#).
