System Leader Regional Collaborations 2025-2026

Overview

LDOE will host regional sessions with system leaders in 2025–2026 to support continuous improvement, strengthen collaboration, and build system coherence. These sessions will focus on improving academic outcomes through the statewide teaching and learning strategy.

Learning Pathways

System leaders may register for the appropriate learning pathway based on their professional role. Pathway descriptions are provided below. Participants should plan to attend all sessions within their selected pathway in the same location throughout the year. Each system is asked to have representation in each pathway.

System Coherence	Superintendents, CAOs, Assistant Superintendents	Superintendents and their CAOs will engage in collaborative learning focused on setting system level expectations on lesson preparation and teacher collaboration. Participants will also develop how central office staff can build capacity in system and school leaders to support these areas.

Attendance	Child Welfare and Attendance Supervisors, Student Services Leaders	System leaders will learn about key elements of the Department's comprehensive, targeted attendance strategy that supports consistent school attendance resulting in improved academic outcomes for all students. Session topics will include attendance data analysis, goal setting, progress monitoring, and best practices for improvement.	
High School Opportunities	Career and Technical Education Supervisors	System leaders will engage in a hands-on planning session focused on strengthening career readiness opportunities that lead to meaningful post-secondary outcomes for students. Topics will include expanding dual enrollment offerings, increasing industry-based credential attainment, developing work-based learning experiences, and aligning programs to regional workforce needs. Participants will collaborate to assess current practices and identify next steps to enhance CTE programs in their systems.	
Business Managers Collaboration	Business Managers	Business Managers and lead business officials will share in collaborative discussions regarding budgets, financial reporting, and strategic financial initiatives to safeguard assets and provide resources to maximize student learning.
