### **Student Telecommunications Devices Policy**

Act 313 of the 2024 Regular Legislative Session prohibits students from possessing electronic telecommunication devices throughout the instructional day.

Traditional public districts must submit a copy of their student telecommunication device policies, newly adopted or revised, in accordance with <u>BESE policy</u>, no later than March 1, 2025.

### High Dosage Tutoring Fiscal Reporting

#### **Allowable Expenses**

The funds for the HDT allocation must be used for the following expenses:

- Salary and benefits for full or part time LEA staff
- External tutoring provider (on LDOE vendor guide)

#### Collection

- The collection will take place in <u>eGMS</u> in the same Accelerate: High Dosage Tutoring application. Use the Fiscal Monitoring User Guide and the School System Support Guidance Document for step-by-step instructions.
- LEAs will report the amount spent each quarter along with the receipts.
- LEAs will report any additional funds spent on Accelerate: HDT, including the amount and funding source.

#### **Timeline**

- Due January 31: Quarter 1 Reporting (July, August, September) and Quarter 2 Reporting (October, November, December)
- Due April 30: Quarter 3 Reporting (January, February, March)
- Due July 31: Quarter 4 Reporting (April, May, June)



### **High Dosage Tutoring: On-Site Monitoring**

School system-level personnel should use the self-assessment checklist during informal observations to evaluate a school's implementation of the Accelerate High Dosage Tutoring program and determine if a school meets all the requirements outlined in Act 771 of the 2024 Legislative Session. The Self-Assessment Rubric focuses on two key indicators of high dosage tutoring: (1) quality of tutoring services and (2) engagement.

### Criminal Background Check (CBC) for Certification

- Effective January 1, 2025, Louisiana law (R.S. 17:8.9) requires criminal background checks (CBCs) for certification.
- A CBC will be required before a certificate can be issued, renewed, advanced, or modified.
- Certification applications submitted **before** January 1, 2025 will be processed without additional CBC requirements.
- Once an applicant is fingerprinted for the purposes of certification, they will be issued a "Credential Clearance" that will not expire and will be outward-facing and verifiable on the certification website.



### Timely Updates to the CBC Process

- The \$25 LDOE CBC review and processing fee has been eliminated, reducing costs for educators.
- The Credential Clearance (CC) application packet is **no longer** required.
- Applicant authorization and consent are now included in the updated Professional Conduct (PC) form for all certification applications.



### Level Up: School Support Institutes at TLS 2025

The final session of <u>School Support Institutes</u>, Level Up SSI: Preparing for Continuous School Improvement, required for CIR schools, will be delivered at Teacher Leader Summit 2025.

- One half-day session of *Level Up SSI* is required for three ILT members from each CIR school (principal & two others).
- Funds are provided through SuperApp to reimburse costs, including registration, associated with attendance for three ILT members per CIR school.
- A designated registration link for Teacher Leader Summit will be emailed to CIR school leadership teams once available. Systems may elect to register their CIR leadership teams as a group using a purchase order.

- Collection Email Outreach: Scheduled weekly and focused on high-impact data elements throughout January-February
- **Phone Calls:** Conducted daily by EICs to assigned systems January-February
- **Critical Meetings:** 1:1 support meetings beginning in February
- **Geocoding Outreach:** Focused on geocoding issues, January-February
- **Superintendent Emails:** Superintendents receive high-level summaries of current collection state at strategic points during the collection
- **Accountability Outreach:** Post-collection discussions focused on major discrepancies in data from prior collection

### Diploma and Diploma Seal Orders

The Diploma and Seal Order form is now open to request diplomas for the 2025 high school graduates.

- The electronic form should be submitted by *Friday*, *February 7*.
- Only one form should be submitted for each school system. The Department of Education will cover the cost of the initial order and distribution.
- Each school system should order 10% over the number of diplomas needed. This overage will take care of misprints, late enrolled students, etc.

### 2024 - 2025 CDF Mid-Year Expenditure Report

The 2024-2025 Mid-Year Career Development Fund (CDF) Expenditure Report is available for school systems to complete. The deadline to report on 2024-2025 CDF mid-year expenditures is February 28. Schools systems should reference the 2024-2025 Guidelines for Use of CDF Allocation when completing the form.

CDF funds support increased student access to high-value Career and Technical Education courses and training. CDF funds are 6% of the MFP State and Local Base Cost Per Pupil (\$241) provided for each qualifying student course enrollment in grades 9-12.

### **Local Authorizer Reporting**

Local school boards who have received an application for a locally authorized charter during the 2024-2025 Annual RFA Cycle are required to consider all applicants by January 17.

Prior to approving a charter for a Type 1 or Type 3 school, school systems are required to hold a public meeting for the purpose of considering the proposal and receiving public input.

The deadline to notify LDOE of decisions regarding the approval or denial of received applications is **January 31** through the <u>Jotform</u> process.



#### **RFA Informational Sessions**

The Office of School Choice will host informational sessions for applicants interested in applying as a Type 2, 4, or 5 charter. Informational sessions will be offered three times during the month of January and will be held virtually.

The first informational sessions were held on January 9 and January 16.

### **Charter School Program (CSP) Grant**

- The Office of School Choice will conduct a winter/spring CSP application cycle. Potential applicants should submit a CSP Letter of Intent to cspgrant@la.gov.
- Technical assistance will be provided to applicants throughout the application process including eligibility determination and through submission of the CSP application.
- For more information, please refer to the <u>Program Description</u>, attend the upcoming informational session, or schedule an appointment during CSP office hours.

### Criminal Background Checks for Employment

- LA R.S. 17:15 requires employers to direct employees to obtain a state and federal criminal background check (CBC) and defines "employees"
- LA R.S. 15:587.1 requires all background checks for school employment to be conducted through the Louisiana State Police (LSP) Bureau of Criminal Identification and Information
- Third-party background check businesses do not provide fingerprint-based CBCs run through LSP's Bureau
- Charter and nonpublic schools are not exempt



### **Board Member Requirements**

Beginning June 1, 2025, each new member of the board of directors of a BESE-authorized charter operator shall participate in at least one hour of board governance, special education, and financial management training **coordinated by LDOE** within one year of appointment to the board.



### **Early Childhood Care and Education**

Early Childhood Community Network Lead Agencies are completing Coordinated Enrollment Plans for the 2025-2026 academic year. These plans include information related to how each network will do the following:

- Coordinate information so families are aware of all available early childhood programs with open seats in the community.
- Coordinate eligibility so families know the early childhood programs for which they qualify.
- Coordinate applications for enrollment, enabling families to apply to all birth-5 publicly funded programs through one application.
- Match families to available early childhood programs based on family preference.
