CISA offers new micro-challenges on Try Cyber that are now part of the Cyber Careers Pathway Tool, located on the National Initiative for Cybersecurity Careers and Studies (NICCS_{TM}) website. Professional Learning Platform

The LDOE will be releasing a <u>Professional Learning Platform</u> this spring for all school system employees at no cost to the school system. This user-friendly, statewide platform will house all professional learning and the <u>Professional Learning Partner Guide</u> in this one platform; professional learning modules and webinars will no longer live on the LDOE website. System and school level leaders will also be able to create professional learning modules in the platform.

Professional Learning Platform

School systems can continue providing their employees EdLink credentials and Canopy permissions. All Louisiana educators will need to have a MyLa account and EdLink credentials. Encourage your superintendent to opt-In through EdLink Security to grant all classroom teachers a role in Canopy. For districts that have not opted-in, the LEA Security Coordinator will have to manually approve each teacher's Canopy Learner request.



FCC Cybersecurity Pilot Program

The FCC Cybersecurity Pilot Program was published in the federal register on Dec. 29th with comments being due on or before January 29, 2024 and reply comments due on or before February 27, 2024.

Key takeaways:

- Applicants will be required to complete a pre-application and be approved to submit a formal Form 470/471 application to participate in the program.
- The FCC is deciding on what type of applications to fund (large statewide or multi-school system) applications or small single school system applications).
- The pilot would provide funding to eligible K-12 schools and libraries to defray the qualifying costs of receiving the cybersecurity and advanced firewall services.
- Protection of the overall Universal Services Fund from excessive costs related to cybersecurity.



EPC Administration Window and CEP Changes

The EPC administrative window will close tomorrow January 12th. Any changes not made during this window can be adjusted in PIA. Applicants should note on their Form 471 if changes or a RAL will be filed to update entity information.

Additionally, the FCC will be releasing new guidance on CEP changes in the coming weeks, this may impact data entered on entities. USAC will be instructing applicants to make necessary changes as part of the PIA or RAL process.



State Validation

In January, we will be sending out validation emails for preparing the State's Valid file for USAC. If you have not updated your District Contact Form, please do that now to ensure the correct E-Rate contact in your LEA receives this information. The Contact Form can be found here.

This validation will include your student counts, Individual CEP percentages, group CEP percentages, NSLP numbers and ED numbers by school.

These number must match what you have entered in your Entity Profile in EPC, otherwise your E-Rate application will be delayed and require additional approvals while in PIA review.

End of Emergency Connectivity Fund Equipment Usage

The ECF emergency period will be ending June 30, 2024. Several questions have arisen about what rules apply to equipment that is no longer required to meet current unmet needs or will no longer be covered by ECF after June. The FCC has released additional <u>ECF FAQs</u> to answer questions.

Key takeaways:

- If a school's ECF-funded device or hotspot has been provided to a student or school staff member with an unmet need and for remote learning but is later returned during the relevant funding period the school is not required to redistribute the equipment to satisfy an unmet need and for remote learning purposes.
- After the emergency period ends on June 30, 2024, schools have the discretion to use eligible
 equipment as they deem appropriate so long as it is used for educational purposes, remains subject to
 the three-year prohibition on resale set out in section 54.1713(b), and the school or library complies
 with the asset inventory requirements set out in section 54.1715 of the Commission's rules.

Upcoming E-Rate Deadlines - Continued

- Jan 29 Invoice (or invoice deadline extension request) deadline for FY 2022 non recurring service FRNs.
- Feb 28 Last day to file a Form 470 for FY 2024 to ensure the 28 days posting requirement is met.
- March 27 Close of the Form 471 application window for FY 2024. To be considered as having been filed "in window," Form 471s must be filed and certified by 11:59 p.m. EDT.
