

- Must be provided by a system level leader
- Submissions without at least three School System Endorsements (representative of at least ten schools) will not be eligible for review.

# MOY and EOY Literacy Screening Gifted Referral Data Collection

Louisiana <u>R.S. 17:24.9</u> mandates school systems to report the number of students identified for referral for gifted evaluation for literacy screening administration for Kindergarten through Grade 3.

The following data sets will be collected for each grade level:

- The number of gifted students scoring in the above-average range on the literacy screener
- The number of non-gifted students referred for additional screening
- The number of non-gifted students referred for gifted evaluation

Collection will open soon and will be due by the end of May. Stay tuned for an announcement in the newsletter regarding submission.

# SPED Fellow Academy Application: 2025-2026 **School Year**

# DIF Grant: Middle to High School (M2HS) Pilot **Initiative**

# **SEAC Report Collection Open**

- Pursuant to <u>R.S. 17:1944</u>, the LDOE is collecting school systems' Special Education Advisory Council (SEAC) report. Legislation requires that the report be posted annually on the local systems' website. Please <u>submit</u> one website link to the approved report per school system by **May 31**.
- Required reporting components include:
  - Special education financial data, including federal, state, and local funding;
  - Subgroup academic data on students receiving special education and related services; and,
  - Compliance violations relative to special education requirements.

# **Applied Behavior Analysis Guidance**

Act 745 of the 2024 Regular Legislative Session amended Louisiana Revised Statute 17:173 regarding applied behavior analysis (ABA) services in schools. The policy approved by BESE in August 2024 is now final in Bulletin 135 -Health and Safety. Please refer to the guidance document for school and system leaders to assist in effective implementation of the statutory and policy provisions.

# **Act 108 Reporting- Science of Reading**

Act 108 requires that LEAs report the number of teachers and school administrators who have completed a LDOE approved foundational literacy skills course.

Reporting information was sent out in early April and is due May 1. Please complete the jotform for reporting.
