#### Zearn

Zearn continues to support math improvement in Louisiana this year through school accounts.

- School accounts are available for all public schools serving grades K-8.

### **Financial Literacy Activities**

Additional <u>financial literacy activities</u> have been added to the <u>Louisiana Math</u> page under the High School Guidance section. These resources include a year long project that can be used alongside your existing financial literacy curriculum. All activities are aligned with <u>Act 267</u> and <u>Act 48</u>, and include content on scholarships, grants, and other financial resources available to support postsecondary education.

#### K-3 Numeracy Screener

The Louisiana Department of Education is implementing the K-3 Numeracy Screener in alignment with Act 650 (2024) and Bulletin 118. The 2025-2026 school year administration of the screener will be a part of a learning year.

- Beginning of Year Screener Window (BOY): First 30 days of school
- Middle of Year Screener Window (MOY): December
- End of Year Screener Window (EOY): April

### K-3 Numeracy Screener

All staff who serve as school test coordinators or test administrators for the statewide K-3 numeracy screener in KITE must complete the K-3 Numeracy Test Administrator Training that is available in the Louisiana Professional Learning Platform. To administer the screener, test administrators must score at least 80% and provide their certificate to the school test coordinator.

This training includes examples of screener items with scoring rules, test security requirements, and allowable accommodations.

### Louisiana Numeracy Excellence Act


The <u>Louisiana Numeracy Excellence (LANE) Act of 2025</u> expands the <u>Act 260 (2023)</u> requirements for numeracy professional learning.

- Act 260 requires all grades 4-8 math teachers to complete numeracy professional learning by August 2025.
- LANE requires all K-3 math teachers to complete numeracy professional learning by August 2027.
- Please see the <u>Numeracy Professional Learning</u> guidance for more information.

## Louisiana Numeracy Excellence Act

Teachers who completed the 4-8 course who teach K-3 this year will be granted credit for overlapping modules.

An optional course is available for high school teachers.



- Literacy Screener all K-3 students, 3x per year with parent reporting within 15 days
  - Home Connect Report at-home literacy activities
  - Family resources from HQIM
- Individual Academic Support Plans for all students below proficiency
- K-3 School Literacy Plans posted on website
- Literacy Coach to support teachers



### **Third Grade Promotion - BOY**

- Review Beginning of the Year data to determine areas of growth/decline
- Verify all families have received BOY reports and communication
- Ensure daily targeted small-group interventions and progress monitoring, as well as Accelerate: High Dosage Tutoring

### **Third Grade Promotion: Subsequent Year Support**

- Students repeating third grade:
  - Parent notification of progress monitoring protocol, intervention plan, and suggestions for strategies to use at home
  - Daily 90-minute reading block and 30-minute intervention block
  - Trained teacher who is highly effective in reading growth
- Students promoted to fourth grade via good cause exemption:
  - Individual Academic Support Plan (IASP) for reading
  - Parent conference to share progress monitoring protocol, intervention plan, and suggestions for strategies to use at home
  - LEA support to schools and teachers for strategy implementation



### **Literacy Myth Buster: Oral Language**

Myth: Oral language isn't as important as reading and writing skills.

**Truth:** Oral language is the foundation of literacy. Strong vocabulary, listening comprehension, and speaking skills directly support decoding, fluency, and reading comprehension. Students who engage in rich conversations, discussions, and storytelling build the background knowledge and linguistic structures they need to become proficient readers and writers.

### **Accelerate: High-Dosage Tutoring**

As school systems begin planning for the 2025–2026 school year, the LDOE encourages leaders to utilize the updated documents on the tutoring landing page to inform planning and decision-making related to Accelerate: High-Dosage Tutoring:

- Accelerate: High-Dosage Tutoring School System Implementation Guidance,
- Accelerate: High-Dosage Tutoring Guidance
- Accelerate: High-Dosage Tutoring FAQ

The updated documents provide answers to common questions about implementation, eligibility, funding, and instructional requirements. They support school systems in aligning with Act 771 and effectively planning tutoring for the 2025–2026 school year.

### **Accelerate: High-Dosage Tutoring**

School systems should submit their Accelerate: High-Dosage Tutoring Plans through eGMS by **September 15** to LDOE for approval. The Accelerate: High-Dosage Tutoring Workbook provides school systems with a structured framework to plan their implementation. The Workbook will help ensure schools systems are prepared for reporting to the LDOE in eGMS.

### Next steps:

- Appoint an Accelerate: HDT point of contact.
- Convene a group of system and school leaders to develop the school system plan and champion the work for the system.
- Determine system-level expectations for identifying students, developing schedules, and planning for sessions.
- Communicate expectations with school leaders.

## Numeracy Alternate Assessment Rubric (NAAR) Overview

- Alternate assessment to the K-3 Numeracy Screener for students with significant cognitive disabilities (SWSCD) in kindergarten 3<sup>rd</sup> grade
  - Only for students whom the Individualized Education Program (IEP) team has used the K-2 Alternate Assessment Decision Making Tool or the 3-11 Alternate Assessment Criteria to determine eligibility should be scored on the numeracy screener using NAAR.
- The special educator should begin to complete the rubric by first reviewing the rubric strands and determining the student's ability level.
- The test administrator should utilize daily curriculum materials to assess the student and assign NAAR scores from "Not Yet Emerging" (1 point), "Emerging" (2 points), "Approaching Target" (3 points), "At Target" (4 points), and "Skill Accuracy" (5 points).

### **LEADS Updates**

- All evaluators and designated observers must pass the annual evaluator certification assessment in the LDOE Professional Learning Platform annually to remain in "good standing."
  - First-time LEADS evaluators or designated observers are required to attend <u>evaluator training</u> and pass the certification assessment prior to observing.
- Registration information will soon be available for <u>LEADS Implementation</u> On-Site Support Sessions.

### LES Closeout Reminders for 2024-2025

- Systems should continue finalizing educator evaluations for the 2024-2025 school year. Evaluations (including VAM teachers) may be finalized if all required components are complete.
- Evaluations should be marked incomplete for any employee that did not receive an evaluation. Refer to Bulletin 130 for the conditions that allow an evaluation to be marked incomplete.
- The deadline for entering educator evaluation data will be announced after VAM results are available this fall.



### **LES Updates for 2025-2026**

For the 2025-2026 evaluation period, staff extract data must be uploaded to Edlink 360 before evaluations can begin.

- This includes updated position codes, locations, and assignments.
- After completing uploads, the LES system contact can begin to verify rosters and assign evaluators.

Systems should utilize the <u>LES Timeline</u> for additional tasks and deadlines.

### Louisiana Educator Certification (LEC) portal

LEC has been integrated into the Louisiana Educator Portal (LEP).

- School system personnel already using LEP for evaluation should only need to request permissions for the application portions.
- Nonpublic HR personnel and Preparation Providers will need:
  - An eScholar Staff ID.
  - A MyLA account.
  - Request permissions for the application portions.
- Instructions to request permissions are currently linked on <u>TeachLALive!</u> if you have an authorized HR or Preparation account.
- Send a request through the <u>Teacher Certification Help Center</u> if you do not have an authorized TeachLALive! account.

### **Applicant Access Requirements**

- Educators already using LEP for evaluation should not need any additional access or accounts to start applications.
- Educators not already using LEP will only need a MyLA account.
- Applicants who have not used LEP for evaluation may need to validate their SSN before they can access applications.
- New hires and other applicants who are not reported as employed for 2025-26 may also need to validate their SSN.
- Share the Logging in to the Louisiana Educator Portal Individual Applicants article from the Help Center with educators.

### **Teacher Exit Survey 2024-2025**

The Teacher Exit Survey data collection period is now open.

- Systems are required to enter annual teacher exit data, per Act 466 of the 2008 regular legislative session (R.S. 17:7 (27)).
- Instructions on how to complete the process are available on TeachLouisiana.net.
- The survey is available for submissions through September 12, 2025.
