# **Spotlight: Third Grade Promotion**



## R.S. 17:24.11: Third Grade Retention and Promotion

Prohibits promotion to the fourth grade of certain students whose reading deficiencies have not been remediated by the end of the third grade.

- Applies to those students in traditional public schools
- Literacy screening
- Individual reading plan
- Exceptions for good cause
- Required instructional services to retained students



## Composite

Promotion is dependent on the composite score which is composed of the following subtests:

- Nonsense Words Fluency: Correct Letter Sounds and Whole Words Read
- Oral Reading Fluency: Accuracy and Automaticity
- Words Read Fluency: High-Frequency Words
- Maze: Comprehension



### **Nonsense Words**

- Mimics English spelling patterns only
- Assesses the alphabetic principle and primary phonics
- Assesses the student's ability to use decoding strategies
- Provides insight into student application of phonemic awareness and decoding strategies
- Assesses ability of decode multisyllabic words
- Should NOT be taught. Students will increase their performance on the nonsense word reading assessments if provided with explicit and systematic instruction in sound-symbol correspondences and phonics.

## **Oral Reading Fluency**

- Addresses accuracy ability to apply advanced phonics and word recognition in the reading of connected text
- Addresses automaticity the rate to which a student reads
- **BOTH** impact comprehension



## **Oral Reading Fluency**

#### Instruction

- Low accuracy, low fluency benefit from systematic, explicitly instruction in phonics and word-level reading accuracy and automaticity
- High accuracy, low fluency benefit from opportunities for ample fluency practice through multiple reads of text with focus on students' phrasing, pausing at punctuation, and reading with expression



### **Timeline**


Students are given three opportunities to score above well below.

- EOY benchmark in April
- School systems may administer the second EOY grade 3 screener during their last week of school, but no earlier.
- With this change, we will now require that the 3<sup>rd</sup> and final grade 3 screening be given no sooner than two weeks after the second screening.
- You can choose to begin later than your last week of school and you can choose to have more than two weeks between the second and third screener to accommodate the remediation that you are planning for your students.



# Decision Making Flowchart

\*Local pupil progression determines other promotion requirements, such as grades and absenteeism.



## **Good Cause Exemptions**

- A student with Limited English Proficiency who has been enrolled in an English language assistance program for fewer than two years. If a student comes from out of state and was in an English language assistance program, then those years count.
- An Individualized Education Program (IEP) indicates that the screener is not appropriate for the student with a disability for the purpose of retention.
- A student's Individualized Education Program or Section 504 Plan reflects
  that intensive reading intervention has been received for two years. The
  IEP or 504 Plan must include a reading goal.

## **Good Cause Exemptions cont.**

- A student who has not met Bulletin 1508 eligibility criteria as a student with an exceptionality, has been previously retained in kindergarten, first, second, or third grade, and has received intensive evidence-based structured literacy intervention for two or more years.
- Intervention should be documented through an individual reading improvement plan (now known as the IASP).
- A student has been diagnosed with dyslexia as documented on an IEP or 504 Plan with accompanying supporting documents or medical diagnosis documentation. This does not include students with characteristics of dyslexia.

## **Good Cause Exemptions cont.**

- A student demonstrates an acceptable level of proficiency on a BESE-approved alternative standardized assessment
- A student, including a student who receives accommodations, who has scores in the Mastery achievement level on the English Language Arts section of the LEAP 2025 assessment

Note: Regardless of a student qualifying for a good-cause exemption, literacy screening, intervention, and progress monitoring should continue.

## **FAQ Responses**

- There is no minimum number of hours required for summer learning. This is an LEA decision.
- LEAs should use available system funding to support summer learning programs.
- Science of Reading training is available through the LDOE Professional Learning Platform.
- A waiver option is not available as this is state statute. This includes an IEP team and parents choosing to have their child not screened.
- Good Cause Exemption forms should be kept in student records at the school.
- All third grade students are held to this law regardless of their enrollment date.



### **Take Action Now**

- Review Middle of the Year (MOY) data to determine areas of growth/decline.
- Verify all families have received MOY reports and communication.
- Ensure daily targeted small-group interventions and progress monitoring.
- Consider using any remaining Accelerate: High Dosage Tutoring funds to target this population of students.
- Prepare for summer learning opportunities.



## **Special Education Camera Maintenance Fund**

BESE approved <u>allocations</u> at its January meeting for additional funds to support maintenance costs related to cameras in certain special education settings as described in legislation.

Funds will be dispersed similar to the initial special education camera funds.



## **IDEA Application Funding Priorities Survey**

Each year, the LDOE submits a grant application on the use of state-level IDEA funds to the U.S. Department of Education. As part of this year's grant application development process, the LDOE is seeking feedback on how to prioritize funding for allowable special education activities. Any interested stakeholders, including school system representatives, parents, educators and other members of the public should complete the survey by March 14.



## **Alternate Assessment Participation Review**

Under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), any school system with **more** than 1.0% of students participating in the ELA, math or science alternate assessment must take certain actions.

2023-2024 LEAP Connect data and corresponding documents will be available in the data management FTP in March. School systems should review their data and take any required actions by April 11.


