Spotlight: Louisiana Student Standards for Math and ELA 2025 Review



History and Context

- The Louisiana Content Standards for English language arts and mathematics were last revised in 2015-2016.
- BESE policy in *Bulletin 741-Louisiana Handbook for School Administrators*, §2301 states, "The Louisiana content standards shall be subject to review and revision to maintain rigor and high expectations for teaching and learning. Such review of each content area shall occur at least once every seven years."



K-12 Louisiana Content Standards Review Goals


English language arts (ELA)

- Strengthen the foundational skills standards progression throughout grades
 K-5 to ensure alignment with the Science of Reading.
- Reinforce a specific, measurable progression of language standards, including grammar, usage, and mechanics, in grades 9-12.
- Provide world, American, and Louisiana reading text complexity, quality, and range exemplars for each grade band.

Math

- Strengthen foundational skills standards progression to ensure the development of advanced skills, including logic and reasoning.
- o Identify relevant mathematics pathways for students in grades 9-12, aiming for success in college, career, or service.

Application Scoring Process

- A committee formed from four LDOE divisions reviewed the applications and blind-scored based upon a rubric.
- The rubric was based on the revision goals, content knowledge, and experience.
- Ranked applications are separated into regions and role groups to assure participation from representative Louisiana stakeholders.

The LDOE will share committee member recommendations with BESE at the March meeting.



Students must have a current evaluation, IEP, and receiving services as of the child count date.

The official MFP Child Count will run on February 20.



April Dunn Act Monitoring

School systems are required to complete the April Dunn Act self-assessment to ensure effective implementation. The <u>self-assessment</u> must be completed by **February 28**.

Self-assessment results should be kept on file. The LDOE will audit self-assessment results to ensure they accurately represent best practices in the implementation of the April Dunn Act.

High Dosage Tutoring Fiscal Reporting

Allowable Expenses

The funds for the HDT allocation must be used for the following expenses:

- Salary and benefits for full or part time LEA staff
- External tutoring provider (on LDOE vendor guide)

Collection

- The collection will take place in <u>eGMS</u> in the same Accelerate: High Dosage Tutoring application. Use the Fiscal Monitoring User Guide and the School System Support Guidance Document for step-by-step instructions.
- LEAs will report the amount spent each quarter along with the receipts.
- LEAs will report any additional funds spent on Accelerate: HDT, including the amount and funding source.

Timeline

- Due January 31: Quarter 1 Reporting (July, August, September) and Quarter 2 Reporting (October, November, December)
- Due April 30: Quarter 3 Reporting (January, February, March)
- Due July 31: Quarter 4 Reporting (April, May, June)



High Dosage Tutoring: On-Site Monitoring

School system-level personnel should use the <u>self-assessment checklist</u> during informal observations to evaluate a school's implementation of the Accelerate High Dosage Tutoring program and determine if a school meets all the requirements outlined in Act 771 of the 2024 Legislative Session. The Self-Assessment Rubric focuses on two key indicators of high dosage tutoring: (1) quality of tutoring services and (2) engagement.

Criminal Background Check (CBC) for Certification

- Effective January 1, 2025, Louisiana law (R.S. 17:8.9) requires criminal background checks (CBCs) for certification.
- A CBC will be required before a certificate can be issued, renewed, advanced, or modified.
- Certification applications submitted **before** January 1, 2025 will be processed without additional CBC requirements.
- Once an applicant is fingerprinted for the purposes of certification, they will be issued a "Credential Clearance" that will not expire and will be outward-facing and verifiable on the certification website.



Timely Updates to the CBC Process

- The \$25 LDOE CBC review and processing fee has been eliminated, reducing costs for educators.
- A Credential Clearance (CC) application packet is not required.
- School systems with Enroll-Your-Own (EYO) workstations may fingerprint applicants for employment and certification, using the associated service codes for each.
- Applicant authorization and consent are now included in the updated Professional Conduct (PC) form for all certification applications.

Level Up School Support Institutes at TLS 2025

The final session of <u>School Support Institutes</u>, Level Up SSI: Preparing for Continuous School Improvement, required for CIR schools, will be delivered at Teacher Leader Summit 2025.

- One half day session of Level Up SSI is required for three ILT members from each CIR school (principal & two others).
