## **Alternate Assessment Participation Review**

Under the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), any school system with **more** than 1.0 percent of students participating in the ELA, math or science alternate assessment must take certain actions.

2023-2024 LEAP Connect data and corresponding documents will be available in the data management FTP later this month. School systems should review their data and take any required actions by April 11.



## **EOY Guidance for DIBELS Administration for Students with Limited Verbal Skills**

#### AAC Options for DIBELS Administration:

- Students may respond using a variety of unaided or aided communication methods, including:
  - Unaided AAC: Gestures, facial expressions, American Sign Language (ASL), finger spelling, or Visual Phonics hand cues.
  - Aided AAC: Communication boards with symbols or text, picture-based systems, printed words, or electronic devices that generate speech.

#### Example: Letter Naming Fluency Subtest

• For students completing the Letter Naming Fluency subtest, the test administrator may point to each letter while the student responds using assistive technology, ASL, finger spelling, and/or a speech-generating device.

## **Upcoming Launch of Kindergarten Dyslexia Screening Platform**

- In accordance with Act 266, the Review 360 platform to administer the Shaywitz DyslexiaScreen will be opening soon.
- The kindergarten screening will take place around the same time as the end of year DIBELS screener.
- This year, district test coordinators will play key roles with assisting with the testing process.

## **High-Dosage Tutoring Act 771**

- Fiscal reporting high-dosage tutoring for quarter 3 is due April 30 in eGMS.
- Annually, by June 1, sites must report high-dosage tutoring for all students receiving either ELA, math, or both disaggregated by specific demographic data and attendance. Data managers have an extract which collects this demographic data and attendance.
  - Attendance requirement
    - Student level by ELA, math, or both
    - Did student attend >/= 75% of the assigned sessions? Y/N
