School Improvement Support

- For 2025-2026, the Division of School Improvement will be merged into the Literacy and Numeracy Divisions.
- School Improvement Support Specialists (SISS) will be available to provide specialized support to system and school leaders in HQPL implementation, focused on improving student outcomes in literacy and/or numeracy.
- System leaders will be able to request this support through a newly released *Teaching & Learning Menu of Services*.



High-Dosage Tutoring Reporting: Student Interventions Extract

Effective August 1, 2024, schools are required to provide high-dosage tutoring to identified students in ELA and math. **Annually, by June 1**, sites must report high-dosage tutoring for all students receiving either ELA, math, or both disaggregated by specific demographic data, attendance, and outcome. This extract collects only demographic data and attendance.

Educator Talent and Workforce Development



LEADS Evaluator Certification and Training

All evaluators and designated observers are required to certify annually prior to conducting observations/evaluations. Previously certified evaluators and designated observers have been enrolled in the 2025-2026 assessment in Canopy, and may begin taking the assessment.

- All first-time LEADS evaluators and designated observers should <u>register</u> and attend all full, consecutive days of evaluator training to be enrolled in the certification assessment.
- Evaluators and designated observers must pass the assessment annually in order to remain in "good standing." A lapse in certification will require additional training.

LES End of Year Reminders

- The Principal Survey is open through May 30 in the Louisiana Evaluation System (LES) for all systems participating in the Louisiana Leader Rubric (LLR) Learning Year. The <u>Principal Survey Guide for Educators</u> can be used as a resource for completing the survey.
- Systems should be finalizing educator evaluations in LES. Evaluations can be finalized, including VAM teachers, if all components are complete by pressing the "Complete Evaluation" button.
- Evaluations should be marked incomplete for any employee who should have been evaluated but did not receive an evaluation. Refer to <u>Bulletin 130</u> for conditions that allow an evaluation to be marked incomplete.

Alternative Pathway 4 Principal Bootcamp

- Capitalizing on leadership skills outside of education
- Diverse backgrounds are eligible to participate Graduate degree in Business Administration or Public Administration, JD or Commissioned Officers.

- The cost of this program is \$1,000.

The LDOE will host the <u>New Teacher Experience: Summer Kick Off</u> on **July 24**, **2025** in Baton Rouge. This will be a full day of professional learning and fun to welcome our new Louisiana teachers.

<u>Registration</u> for this event will be first come, first served. The registration is now open and will close on July 16 or once capacity is reached, whichever comes first.

School systems must have the name and email address of new teachers in order to register for this event.



2025-2026 Pre-Educator Pathway Development & Expansion Funding Application

Funding is available for school systems that are interested in developing and expanding access to the Louisiana Pre-Educator Pathway.

Systems may apply for either <u>Pathway Development Funding or Pathway</u> <u>Expansion Funding</u>, depending on whether they have previously received LDOE funding for Pre-Educator Pathway implementation.

To apply, systems should complete the <u>funding application</u> no later than **May 30**.
