





RESTORATIVE PRACTICES CONTINUUM



PUNITIVE VS. RESTORATIVE

	Punitive	Restorative
Misbehavior identified as:	Breaking school rules, disobeying authority	Harm done to one person/group by another
Process relies on:	Authority figure establishing what rules are broken, and who's to blame	Everyone working to problem solve,
Accountability defined as:	Receiving punishment	Suggesting ways to repair harm and restore community




PUNITIVE VS. RESTORATIVE

	Punitive	Restorative
Goal of the response:	Pain or unpleasantness to deter/prevent	Meaningful resolution to reconcile
Effects of the response:	Short term	Long term

Restorative Questions

Questions you can ask when responding to behaviors:	Questions to ask somebody that has been affected by the actions of others:
What happened?	What did you think when you realized what was happening?
What were you thinking about at the time?	What impact has this had on you? On others?



Restorative Questions

Questions you can ask when responding to behaviors:	Questions to ask somebody that has been affected by the actions of others:
What have you thought about since?	What has been the hardest thing for you?
Who has been affected by what happened? How?	What do you think needs to happen to make things right?
What do you think needs to happen to make things right?
