Criteria for Success: Priorities

For each priority, considered separately

- 1. Precise
 - a. Answers the question, "What work will be done, and to what end?"
 - b. Embraces no more or less than the work described by the associated initiatives (note: check this after developing initiatives)
- 2. **Clear** -- describes the work so that someone outside the system could read it and understand what work is intended
- 3. **Substantial** -- represents a) significant improvement or expansion of existing work or b) new work
- 4. Mutually Exclusive Collectively Exhaustive
 - a. No overlap between the work described by two given priorities
 - b. Include *all* of the school system's major planned work
- 5. Aligned -- aligned with strengths and opportunities revealed by diagnostic
- 6. Manageable -- total of 4 to 6 priorities
