LDH Updated Quarantine Guidance

The Louisiana Department of Health (LDH) is adopting the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) recently updated recommendations regarding options to shorten quarantine due to COVID-19 exposure. The <u>updated guidance</u> is as follows:

- Close contacts of persons with COVID-19 should monitor themselves daily for presence of these <u>symptoms</u> of COVID-19 and should contact their healthcare provider if they develop symptoms.
- Quarantine can end after Day 10 of exposure without testing and if no symptoms have been reported during daily monitoring.
- Where COVID testing is readily available, then quarantine can end after Day 7 if the individual tests negative and if no symptoms were reported during daily monitoring.
 - The CDC recommends a COVID test on or after Day 5 after exposure, and for the individual to quarantine until at least Day 7. Both PCR and antigen tests are allowable to meet the testing criteria.
- In both cases, continued symptom monitoring and masking through day 14 MUST continue. If any symptoms develop prior to day 14, the individual should immediately self-isolate and follow instructions per local public health authority.

School COVID-19 Screening Decision Tree:

Responding to Close Contact - 12.7.2020







- Within 6 feet of someone who tested positive, for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period, regardless of whether either party was wearing a mask:
- Timing of exposure must have taken place within 2 days of the positive person's onset of symptoms or positive test result (whichever came first).





School COVID-19 Screening Decision Tree:

Responding to a Symptomatic Individual – 12.7.2020







COVID-19 symptoms include but are not limited to:

- Fever ≥ 100.4 °F
- · Shortness of breath
- · Chest pain
- Increasingly nonproductive (dry) cough
- · Body aches or fatique
- · GI symptoms (nausea, diarrhea)
- Loss of taste and/or smell
- Other flu or cold like symptoms such as headache, sore throat, or congestion


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Spring Semester 2021 PPE Requests

The LDOE, in collaboration with the Special School District, will be making PPE supplies available for all public, private, and charter school systems that need to replenish their supply for the second semester. Each school system may request an appropriate number of masks equivalent to their student and faculty census. Available supplies include:

- Reusable cloth facial coverings
- Hand sanitizer
