School Reopening Updates

BESE Minimum Health Standards Update:

The emergency rules that BESE adopted, "were developed by the LDE in coordination with the LDH, using guidance provided by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) regarding school settings, defined as a setting in which educational services are provided to children."

To further clarify this, BESE leadership affirms that the aforementioned rules were developed for activities that occur during the instructional day. Therefore, decisions concerning activities that occur outside of the instructional day and/or any other local business affair should be determined by LEAs.

Advanced Placement Updates


- AP Exams will be administered May 3-7 and May 10-14
- If students register for AP Exams this fall, AP will waive the \$40 cancellation or unused exam fee so all students can register with confidence.
- Upcoming Deadlines
 - Preferred ordering deadline for AP Exams is October 2 with a final ordering deadline of November 13
 - October 15 is the deadline for AP Course Audit administrators. This is the preferred date by which AP Course Audit administrators should renew previously authorized courses for the 2020-21 school year.

Hurricane Laura/COVID-19 TOPS Modifications

- Proclamation #124 signed September 18, 2020 which suspends specific provisions for TOPS awards for students affected by Hurricane Laura in the following affected parishes: Acadia, Allen, Beauregard, Caddo, Calcasieu, Cameron, Grant, Jackson, Jefferson Davis, LaSalle, Lincoln, Morehouse, Natchitoches, Ouachita, Rapides, Sabine, St. Landry, Union, Vermilion, Vernon, and Winn.
- Students that graduated in 2020 and didn't have a qualifying score on the ACT or SAT for TOPS now have until December 31, 2020 to register to take an ACT and receive a qualifying score. LOSFA will re-evaluate their eligibility if a new ACT score is received. This applies to students that lived in a Hurricane Laura affected parish or their test site was closed due to actions taken to mitigate the spread of COVID-19.

Hurricane Laura/COVID-19 TOPS Modifications

- Current high school students who lived in a parish severely impacted by Hurricane Laura and have enrolled at a school in another state the proclamation suspends the requirement that a student must live in Louisiana and complete their last four semesters of high school in the state. For students who are now being homeschooled, the proclamation suspends the requirement that a student must begin a home study program no later than the end of their 10th grade year.
- The proclamation suspends the requirement that a student must complete the TOPS core curriculum and have a higher ACT score, should they have to stay in another state to complete their high school education.
- Current college students who live in or attend school in a parish for which FEMA declared a disaster, will receive an automatic exception to the TOPS 24-hour requirement so their award will not be canceled. The requirements to meet steady academic progress and minimum GPA are also suspended for these students.

Midterm Diploma Orders

Complete the Midterm Diploma Order form to request diplomas and endorsement seals for 2020 midterm graduates. Diplomas ordered will include the signature of the new Louisiana State Superintendent of Education. Diplomas utilized from this point forward should include the new signature. The form should be completed **Friday, October 9**. Only one form should be completed for each school system. The Department will cover the costs for the initial order and distribution.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid, commonly referred to as the FAFSA, is the gateway to apply and receive federal and/or state financial aid. Application completion provides students and families access to more than \$120 billion dollars in grants, work-study and student loans each year.

The <u>2021-2022 FAFSA</u> for the 2020-2021 school year opens on October 1. The <u>Louisiana Department of Education (LDOE)</u>, the <u>Louisiana Education Loan Authority (LELA)</u> and the <u>Louisiana Office of Student Financial Assistance (LOSFA)</u> are available to lend support.



- 2. Make the <u>Student Application Packet</u> available to the parents of students eligible to participate in the program.

U.S. Senate Youth

The Louisiana Department of Education and the William Randolph Hearst Foundation announced the launch of the 2021 Virtual United States Senate Youth Program. Two outstanding students from Louisiana will be selected to virtually participate in a series of online meetings during the week of March 15 in 2021. Each delegate will receive a \$10,000 college scholarship from the Hearst Foundation.

Please encourage juniors or seniors who hold elected or appointed offices in school or community groups listed in the <u>national program brochure</u> to submit a Louisiana <u>application packet</u>. If students are unable to hold leadership positions this year due to the pandemic, they can submit the position they held during the 2019-2020 academic year.

The names of the students selected by each high school and their application portfolios must be received at the email address below no later than **November 16**. Finalists will be notified by December 4 for the December 15 final phase of selection.

Carl D. Perkins FY20 Funds

Unexpended 2019-2020 Funds:

- Will not be considered as carry over of unspent dollars; thus allowable expenses follow the rules for the basic grant
- Funds must be expended by October 31

eGMS:

- 2019-2020 funds will show up in eGMS as prior year funds and are available in your Super App application
- Funds must be allocated, budgeted and approved; and if these prior year funds are not allocated, budgeted and approved, current year funds (FY21) will be expended first
- To expend these FY20 funds, submit an amendment by **September 30** and submit requests for reimbursement by **October 31, 2020**

Multiphase Challenge Building Skills for 21st Century Careers

The **US Department of Education** has launched <u>CTE Mission: CubeSat</u> to inspire high school students to build technical skills for careers in space and beyond.

Students are invited to design and build prototypes of CubeSats (cube satellites) that aid in space research; thereby bringing space missions out of the clouds and into the classroom.

No in-person collaboration or prior experience with CubeSats is required. Teams can use a curated collection of **virtual resources** in the **CTE Mission: CubeSat resource hub** to develop their proposals.

The deadline to submit mission proposals is October 16 at 5:59 p.m.
