Math	3-8	PARCC Practice Test: MATH In this session we will discuss how to use the practice test, both to inform your instruction and help prepare your students for the Spring PARCC tests. This session will be offered in rotation 2 only.	
Math	All	Developing Your Students' Ability to Justify, Explain and Critique, part 1  This is an encore presentation of the session from the December Teacher Leader Collaboration Event. The information covered in this session will be identical to the December session. This session will be offered in rotation 1 only.  We will explore the questions:  Why is important that our students can justify, critique and explain in math?  What are the steps to creating a rich classroom discussion about mathematics?	
Math	All	Developing Your Students' Ability to Justify, Explain and Critique, part 2  This session is part 2 of the session that was delivered at the December Teacher Leader Collaboration Event. It is recommended that participants attend Developing Your Students' Ability to Justify, Explain and Critique, part 1 before attending part 2.  This session will be offered in rotation 2 only.  In this session participants will diver deeper into "talk moves" and will practice facilitating rich classroom conversations about mathematics.	
Math	All	Using Rigorous Math Tasks in the Classroom In this session participants will:  • Practice using grade-level specific instructional tasks and extended constructed response tasks to build key skills in math.  • Plan for how they will integrate these tasks into their pre-existing curriculum or unit plans.	
Math	3-8	<ul> <li>Understanding and Using the PARCC Evidence Tables to Inform Instruction         In this session participants will:         <ul> <li>Use PARCC's new Informational Guides to Math Summative Assessments to better understand how students will be assessed and on what content in the PBA and the EOY assessments.</li> <li>Learn to how to read the PARCC Evidence Statements and use them to inform instruction.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

ELA	3-8	PARCC Practice Test: ELA In this session we will discuss how to use the practice test, both to inform your instruction and help prepare your students for the Spring PARCC tests. This session will be offered in rotation 1 only.	
ELA	All	Rereading Complex Text to Develop Understanding In this session we will introduce and model how to break down a text and use rereading to build students' comprehension of complex texts.	
ELA	K-12	Building Vocabulary and Language to Read Complex Texts In this session we will model a lesson on how to use various strategies to build vocabulary and language to read complex texts. Participants will then have the opportunity to practice these skills.	
Social Studies	All	Using Social Studies Instructional Tasks In this session participants will practice using the newly released social studies instructional tasks to increase student learning and prepare students for end of year assessments. This session will be offered in rotation 1 only.	
Science	All	Using the Science Instructional Tasks In this session participants will practice using the newly released science instructional tasks to increase student learning and prepare students for end of year assessments.  This session will be offered in rotation 2 only.
