


Writing assignments do not always have to be essays.

Environmental Science

Biomes are specialized environments for groups of plants and animals. Examples are the tundra, grasslands, deserts, forests, etc. Students research each biome and create a video for the Survivor TV show detailing the benefits and drawbacks of filming in each biome. The goal here is synthesis and comparison of information. Students conduct research using library resources and bibliographies created by the Librarian and teacher.


Tip

THE FIVE W'S OF WEB SITE EVALUATION

WHO

Who wrote the pages and are they an expert? Is a biography of the author included? How can I find out more about the author?

WHAT

What does the author say is the purpose of the site?
What else might the author have in mind for the site?
What makes the site easy to use?
What information is included and does this

information differ from other sites?

WHEN

When was the site created? When was the site last updated?

WHERE

Where does the information come from?
Where can I look to find out more about the sponsor of the site?

WHY

Why is this information useful for my purpose? Why should I use this information? Why is this page better than another? Math
