Hello, everyone! My name is Maribeth Holzer. I taught math for 15 years in Ouachita Parish and am now the middle and high school math coordinator for the parish. I served as a Teacher Leader Advisor last year, creating items for the <u>EAGLE question bank</u>, and I am excited to be working with teacher leaders again this year to create questions that are more aligned to the summative assessments.

As we continue to raise our expectations for our students, assessments can be helpful in two ways: 1) they are one of best ways to get clear on what our students are expected to know and be able to do by the end of the year; 2) they help us figure out our students' progress and how to tweak our instruction.

Last month the Louisiana Department of Education reconfirmed that PARCC ELA and math questions will be the focus of this year's grade 3-8 tests. I encourage everyone to utilize the <u>Classroom Support</u> <u>Toolbox</u> for additional information on <u>standards</u>, <u>end-of-year assessments</u>, <u>math</u> and <u>ELA</u> curricular resources.

Now that we know where our students need to be by the end of the year, it is our job as educators to make sure we have a way to figure out where our students are excelling and where they need more support. EAGLE Enhancements

<u>EAGLE</u> is an online bank of items and tasks aligned to our state end-of-year assessments. In Ouachita Parish, we have used items from EAGLE to build interim assessments that measure our students' progress towards where we need them to be by the end of the year.

A new and improved version of EAGLE will be released on September 29. <u>EAGLE 2.0</u> includes the following enhancements designed to make building a strong interim assessment much easier:

- 1. **New search functionality** a quick and easy way to search for items
- 2. Improved test builder a three step process to build classroom assessments
- 3. **Split screen feature** optional screen arrangement for students
- 4. **Training and support tools** printable resources and video highlights
- 5. **ELA/math Louisiana guidebook items** K-12 items in printer-friendly format
- 6. Science and social studies items Gr 3, 5, 6, 7 items from the retired Louisiana PASS system
