


ACT: Increased College Opportunities for All Students

The Department released 2015-2016 state- and district-level 2 ACT results on July 25. Congratulations to all of our high schools on their hard work this past year to provide more students with access to college and TOPS.

In 2016:

- A record 25,144 high school seniors in the class of 2016 earned a college-going score (18+), an increase of 463 students in 2015 and an increase of 6,837 students since 2012.
- The state's average composite score for public school students increased 0.1 points, from 19.4 in 2015 to 19.5, and has increased 0.4 points since 2013.
- Economically disadvantaged students increased 0.2 points from 17.9 in 2015 to 18.1 in 2016, doubling the state growth of 0.1, and have increased 0.5 points since 2013.
- African-American students have likewise narrowed pernicious achievement gaps since 2012, closing the gap with their peers by 0.3 points.














Louisiana Student Science Standards Review

In June, BESE approved an official review of the Louisiana Student Science Standards. This review must ensure that the standards are rigorous and represent the knowledge and skills needed for students to successfully transition to postsecondary education and the workplace.

Like the ELA and math review process, this review will be led by:

- content experts
- elementary and secondary educators
- postsecondary education leaders
- business and industry leaders

Parents and the general public can participate in the review process through the online review portal and by sharing feedback in the standards review committee meetings.

Nominations were solicited statewide from several education associations, local school systems, and key stakeholder organizations representing parents and business and industry leaders.

From these nominations, a diverse group of 87 individuals was compiled, representing every sector mentioned in the law, as well as every geographic region of the state.

2016-2017 Implementation

The Legislature approved a compromise regarding standards and accountability.

- The new Louisiana Student Standards will be implemented in 2016-2017.
- The accountability, student promotion, and Compass transition policies continue through the 2016-2017 school year.
- After the transition policies conclude and the calculation of value-added data resumes, student growth will
 continue to count for 50 percent of a teacher's evaluation. However, value-added will make up only 35 percent
 of a teacher's evaluation.

For the 2016-2017 school year, as in the past three years, BESE's transition policies will remain in place, resulting in the following:

- Promotion decisions will continue to be made locally.
- Teacher value-added data will not be calculated.
- School and district letter grade distributions will not drop below the 2012-2013 distribution.


Teacher Exit Survey Reminder

State law requires all local education agencies to compile and report exit data on teachers who leave their employ on an annual basis. This teacher exit survey data is reported to the legislature in December.

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LEAP 2025 ELA and Mathematics Assessments

As part of the move to a more comprehensive assessment system in grades 3 through high school, the Department released a Request for Proposals on June 8 that seeks a vendor to provide a Louisiana-specific English language arts and mathematics test called LEAP 2025 with questions based on Louisiana's unique standards. The procurement process only determines a vendor; it does not determine the content of the test, which is determined by the standards.

The RFP seeks the following:

- Assessments unique to Louisiana in grades 3 through 8, English I, English II, Algebra, and Geometry
 - Summative
 - Diagnostic, for use at the discretion of districts
 - Interims, for use at the discretion of districts
- Formative tasks for kindergarten to grade 2, for use at the discretion of districts
- Support resources (e.g., assessment guides, practice tests, released items)

LEAP 2025 ELA and Math Assessment Materials Timeline

Below is the timeline for when the LEAP 2025 assessment RFP will be awarded and key assessment materials will be released this fall and winter.

Social Studies Assessments

- The social studies field tests this spring were shortened forms containing 4 to 5 item sets (depending upon grade level), a handful of stand-alone items, and a task set.
- The new operational forms of 2016–2017 will contain 6 to 7 item sets (depending upon grade level), some stand-alone items, and a task set.
- Operational forms will also contain some embedded field-test items, that do not count toward students' scores, in order to build new operational test forms.
- The new operational test design, determined after the data from the field test was analyzed, is now available in the <u>Assessment Guides</u>. Session timing data continues to be analyzed and will be available in the September update of the Assessment Guides.

Science Assessments

- Science assessments (LEAP, iLEAP, EOC) for 2016–2017 will continue to be structured the same as previous years' assessments.
- Once the revision process for science standards is completed in 2016–2017, the Department will work to develop new science assessments.
- Grades 3–8 science assessments continue to remain as paper-based tests for 2016–2017.
- Science assessment guides remain available in the <u>Assessment Guidance</u> library.
 Necessary updates to links and additional information related to the new EOC testing platform have been included in the August posting of the science Assessment Guides.

EOC Assessments

As districts implement the Louisiana Student Standards in ELA and mathematics during the 2016–2017 school year, the Department works to revise the End-of-Course (EOC) assessments to provide a seamless, comprehensive summative assessment system.

- Existing question banks for Algebra I, English II, Geometry, and English III have been reviewed to remove questions that no longer align to the Louisiana Student Standards and to identify areas where test questions are needed due to new or revised standards.
- In 2016–2017, new items will be developed and field-tested through an embedded design similar to previous years' tests.
- This process allows districts time to implement the new standards (for example, the statistics standards that are new to Geometry) while not holding students accountable for this new content this year.
- The 2016–2017 school year also allows time for the development of the new English I assessment.
- EOC assessments for 2016–2017 will look and feel much the same as previous years while
 providing time for districts to implement the Louisiana Student Standards and for the Department
 to develop new EOC assessments capable of reporting student achievement at 5 performance
 levels.

EOC System

The EOC system will move from Pacific Metrics to DRC. Schools will conduct future EOC tasks and test administrations using the DRC platform. EOC assessments for 2016–2017 will look and feel much the same as previous years. Key activities associated with the transition are below.

Key Dates for EOC Test History and Reports

- August 31: The EOC system will be inaccessible during this transition to the DRC platform. Schools and districts that need reports from this system should retrieve them prior to this date by accessing the <u>EOC website</u>.
- After August 31, districts will need to retrieve EOC test histories using the LIQ-LEADS Inquiry system. The EOC system will be available through August 31, 2016.

Louisiana's Assessment System: Non-Summative Assessments

Non-Summative Assessments

As Louisiana continues to reform teaching and learning through the establishment of new standards and new summative assessments, it is important for us to reexamine non-summative assessment practices throughout the state.

This year, the Department will work toward the following objectives:

- 1. Provide districts and schools with high quality assessment items
- 2. Provide districts and schools with meaningful information on student performance throughout the school year
- Provide districts and schools with access to the same systems and processes they will utilize for the summative assessments

EAGLE 2.0 Transition

August

- This month the Department will conduct quality control checks to ensure that EAGLE items were transferred and rendered correctly in the new platform.
- To prepare for the new school year, districts that choose to administer non-summative
 assessments in the DRC platform, must sign the new <u>DRC (Non-Summative</u>
 Assessment) data sharing agreement.

September

- Districts (District Test Coordinators) will be given permissions and instructions to set up district/school level access.
- Every Thursday, the Department will host office hours to answer specific EAGLE 2.0 questions.
- EAGLE 2.0 training will be provided at the first Supervisor/Teacher Leader
 Collaboration Event.

Louisiana's Assessment System: Transition to Online Assessments

Transitioning to Online Assessments in 2016–2017

In 2016–2017 grades 3–8 will complete the transition to computer-based tests, with a paper option remaining for grades 3 and 4. End-of-Course (EOC) exams will also move to this same platform.

A smooth transition to online testing requires that a number of factors be addressed within schools and districts:

- Classroom Instruction

- Network
- Broadband Internet



Digital Literacy

Digital literacy is the ability to use technology to find, evaluate, create, and communicate information. The <u>Digital Literacy Guide</u> provides a guideline for teachers as they support their students in learning to use technology.

Skills are noted as introductory and mastery at each grade level and organized into seven specific categories:

- Basic Computer Operations
- Word Processing
- Spreadsheet (Tables, Charts, and Graphs)
- Mathematical Applications
- Presentation and Multimedia Tools
- Acceptable Use, Copyright, Plagiarism, and Online Safety
- Research and Information Gathering
- Communication and Collaboration



Planning for Digital Literacy

This summer there are a number of questions related to digital literacy that districts should be asking themselves in order to prepare for 2016–2017. Some of these are included below.

Digital Literacy

- Has the transition to online assessments been communicated to all school leaders and teachers?
- What is the plan to prepare teachers for the transition to online assessments?
- How is technology being authentically embedded into instruction in 2016–2017 on a regular basis?
- What is the plan for supporting students in acquiring grade-appropriate technology skills?
- What resources are needed to support digital literacy in 2016–2017?

Action Steps:

- Share the <u>Digital Literacy Guidance</u> document with leaders and teachers.
- Plan for technology to be embedded within instruction on a regular basis.
- Support teachers in embedding technology within instruction.

Technology Readiness

Technology Readiness

Technology Readiness includes evaluating devices for compatibility, measuring network capacity, and completing general maintenance and management of related systems.

The Technology Readiness Tool provides LEAs a mechanism for tracking and analyzing school and district devices, network readiness, and broadband readiness for supporting both classroom learning and assessments. The tool is open year-round for LEAs to submit and update their data, as well as pull reports to inform administrative decisions related to upgrades, new purchases, and strategic planning.

Assessment Administration Readiness: Online Platform

Assessment administration readiness includes platform-specific installations and configurations. In 2016–2017, Louisiana will utilize DRC's Insight assessment platform for the following assessments:

- Statewide summative assessments for grades 3 through 8
- EOC assessments
- EAGLE
- Non-summative assessments (e.g., interim and diagnostics)

The platform is designed to work with technology commonly available in schools. The <u>Testing Device Requirements</u> guidance, updating in July, outlines the minimum and recommended system requirements.

Additionally the OTT:

- may be reviewed as many times as desired;
- is not to be considered representative of an actual test;
- is available once Insight is installed or by <u>link</u> using Google Chrome browser;
- is now available for grades 3-8; and
- will be available in mid-August for EOCs.

Action Step: Share the OTT with teachers and encourage them to use them with students this fall.



Early Childhood: Teaching and Learning

Aligned Curriculum, Assessment and Professional Development for PreK

- The Department continues to complete <u>Instructional Materials Reviews</u> of birth to five curricula. More than 10 review were added over the summer.
- Based on a survey of programs last year, many pre-K programs were not using Tier I curriculum in their classrooms.

Action Step: Ensure all pre-K classrooms are using or are preparing to implement a Tier I curriculum in 2016-2017.

Pilot for Special Learners

- In August, the Department will launch a <u>pilot</u> to provide high-quality professional development rooted in the *CLASS* system of measures to teachers who serve children birth to age five with special needs.
- Selected districts will be announced at the August BESE board meeting.



2016-2017 TOPS Funding Update

The annual TOPS Award Amount is the total amount TOPS would pay for a student if TOPS was fully funded for the 2016-2017 academic year. The <u>pro-rata amount</u> for the fall semester is the maximum amount that will be paid for a student's TOPS Award in the fall semester of 2016.

At this time, the winter/spring pro-rata amounts are estimated. The maximum amount that will be paid for TOPS in the winter quarter and spring semester/quarter will be revised based on actual billing numbers for fall received by the October 14 deadline.

The **re-calculated pro-rata amounts will be available by November 1, 2016**. Actual amounts payable for winter/spring are subject to appropriation and funding received.

The **Pupil Progression Plan (PPP)** is the comprehensive plan developed and adopted by each LEA, which establishes policies and guidelines that determine whether K–8 students will be promoted to the next grade, retained in the current grade, or advanced (or skipped) to higher grades. Pupil Progression Plans also outline the criteria for high school graduation.





2015-2016 Fiscal Year Closeout - NCLB and IDEA Consolidated Applications

- Reimbursement Requests have been paid
- 6/30 Periodic Expenditure Reports (PERs) are in the process of review and approval
- Rollover balances are determined by the approved 6/30 PER
- 2015-2016 rollover funds will appear in your application when the next amendment is created

Action Step: Budget for rollover funds

- Review 2015-2016 Applications and identify the object codes with unexpended balances
- Determine if activities in object codes with unexpended funds will continue into 2016-2017
- Budget 2015-2016 rollover funds in the 2016-2017 Application
- Analyze the impact of 2015-2016 rollover funds on the 2016-2017 budget and consider additional uses of funds, for example:
 - 2015-2016 Supply Budget = \$500,000
 - 2015-2016 Rollover Supply Amount = \$150,000
 - 2016-2017 Original Supply Budget = \$500,000
 - Consider eliminating 2015-2016 rollover supply amount or reducing 2016-2017 supply amount to \$350,000 to leverage \$150,000 on an additional need
