Direct Support

As districts plan for the 2014-15 school year, the Department will provide three key types of support.

The Need to Transition

- Louisiana's jobs market is changing: Most Louisiana jobs require education after high school (four-year college or at a two-year technical and community college). In 2011, 28 percent of the Louisiana workforce had a two- or four-year degree. To meet Louisiana's future needs, that number must double.
- Our students are just as capable as their peers around the country: In part, this gap is
 because our own academic expectations do not correspond with the job need. While a
 score of "mastery" or level four out of five denotes readiness to complete at least a year
 of technical college or university on-time, in our state "basic" or level three out of five has
 been accepted as a mark of full proficiency.
- Our students deserve high expectations: Over the last 10 years we have seen a steady increase in our students' "basic" proficiency (over a 15 point increase). We now must turn our attention to increasing the rates of "mastery" student performance.

Why PARCC?

- 1. Our students can demonstrate that they are on par with their peers across the country, through scores that are comparable across 19 states.
- 2. Students will be asked to think independently, not just fill in bubble tests. PARCC is a "test worth taking" as it mirrors the demands of every day life.
- **3. Our state's educators have been involved in test development**, including item reviews and policy making.
- 4. Online testing allows increased accessibility features for all students and more comprehensive accommodations for students with disabilities. Accessibility features include highlighters, adjusted font size, masking tool to block eliminated answer choices, line readers, etc. Accommodations include videos of human interpreters, closed captioning, word prediction, etc.
- 5. The state will not pay more for a higher-quality assessment.

For the first year only, results will not be available until early Fall 2015. Therefore, no summer retests for PARCC will be offered for Summer 2015. Please consider this in defining 4th and 8th grade promotion policies.

Instructional Resource Review

- Materials reviewed: Full math curriculum, ELA materials for whole class instruction and support (ex. text sets, grade-level texts), ELA materials for small group instruction (ex. reading foundations, guided reading, guided writing), ELA materials for independent reading programs, and ELA and math benchmark assessments.
- How it works: Materials are reviewed and posted as they are submitted. The
 <u>Department can not review materials unless they are submitted by the publishers</u>.

 Districts have influence convincing publishers to submit materials.
- **Tiered and Posted**: Once reviewed the materials are tiered using the criteria below:
 - **Tier 1**: **Exemplifies quality of the standards**. The materials meet all non-negotiable criteria and consistently meet additional criteria.
 - **Tier 2: Approaching quality of the standards.** There are some real strengths and some real gaps. All non-negotiable items met, but some additional criteria have gaps.
 - Tier 3: Does not represent quality of the standards. Not all of the non-negotiable items are met.

PARCC Spring 2014 Field Test

The majority of districts will have exposure to PARCC prior to implementation.

- 65 traditional districts and 33 nontraditional schools/charters elected to participate (645 schools and approximately 50,000 students)
- Sampling eased the burden for participation
 - only 2-3 grade levels within a school
 - only selecting 1-2 classes within a grade level
- Students will participate in either the ELA (2 days) or math (1 day) component, not both
- Students will participate in either the phase I, phase II or both components ranging from 2-5 sessions

Phase 1: March 24-April 11, 2014 and Phase 2: May 5-June 6, 2014
