
Academic Planning: Academics

Increasing student learning and improving teacher instruction requires access to high-quality resources and targeted, ongoing professional development to help teachers use those resources effectively.

This spring, school systems will make specific planning decisions around academics, including

- selecting a standards-aligned curriculum;
- choosing and reducing assessments for early childhood through grade 12; and
- choosing profesional development opportunities aligned to standards.

To further support these decisions, the Department has and will release the following tools and resources.



Academics: Curriculum Tools & Resources

High-quality curriculums build content knowledge for students and successfully prepares them for the next level of study. The following curriculum tools exist to support districts in planning for 2016-2017.

- English Language Arts Guidebook 2.0: provides teachers with daily lessons that contain classroom-ready student materials, such as teaching slides and handouts, teaching notes, unit assessments, formative assessments, and student writing exemplars.
- During the 2016-2017 school year, the Department will release 5 units each in grades 3 through 8, 4 units each in grades 9 and 10, and 1 unit each in grades 11 and 12 to all LEAs. Click here for a full list.

Successful principals set academic improvement goals and the vision of their school and support teachers in improving instruction. In order to support principals in these key actions, school systems must make the following key leadership decisions this spring:

Academic Planning: Early Childhood

The path to college and careers starts before kindergarten. Therefore, lead agencies and early childhood programs must make a series of planning decisions around curriculum, assessments, observations, and enrollment this spring to ensure that students in birth-to-five programs are kindergarten ready.

To support lead agencies and early childhood programs in these planning decisions, the Department has or will release the following tools and resources:

Teaching and Learning: Instructional Support

2016-2017 Louisiana Student Standards

On March 4, BESE approved the **2016-2017 Louisiana Student Standards for English** language arts and mathematics, which starts the formal adoption process of the standards. Unless vetoed by the governor, the standards will be effective for the 2016-2017 school year.

The new Louisiana Student Standards

- provide developmentally appropriate content for all grades or courses while maintaining high expectations;
- give teachers freedom to determine the most appropriate method of instruction;
- provide teachers with more clarity about what is expected of students by making the standards less vague and less open to multiple interpretations;
- include the study of money in earlier grades; and
- divide the high school math standards more appropriately into cohesive courses for Algebra I, Geometry, and Algebra II.

The new standards call for changes in what teachers teach. These changes can be addressed with sensible adjustments to curriculum, training, and testing, rather than a radical overhaul.

In order for the Louisiana Student Standards to take effect this fall, school systems, schools, and the Department of Education must work together to implement a plan to make these sensible changes.

These changes will focus on the following areas:

- Curriculum and resources
- Teacher training and professional development
- State and local assessments

Compass: CVR Roster Verification

Roster verification ensures that teachers are assigned to the correct courses and classroom rosters of students for the purposes of transitional student growth data.

• March 21–April 22, 2016: Open for View-only

Time for users to view the roster data for accuracy but no changes can be made in the system. CVR Help Desk will be able to assist with any issues that must be corrected by the Department.

• April 25–May 20, 2016 (4 weeks): CVR Open for Roster Verification

This process allows teachers and principals to ensure the accuracy of their specific courses and students. Data managers use the system to track verification completion at the district and school level. They can also assist with adding or removing courses and students.

Test Administration Preparation: March Key Action Steps

- Deliver test security, preparation, and administration training to TAs and other applicable school and district personnel
- Ensure that TAs, proctors, and monitors are appropriately assigned to testing groups

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Measuring Student Success: Cohort Graduation Certification

Cohort Graduation Indices: Graduation Rate

Two indices are used to calculate 50% of the school performance scores for high schools with grade 12. The 2016 SPS will include indices that use the 2014-2015 graduation cohort to determine a graduation rate index and a strength of diploma index.

The *graduation rate index* (25% of SPS) uses the graduation rate, which is the number of students who graduate with a regular high school diploma in four years, divided by the total number of cohort members.

Cohort Graduation Rate (CGR)	Formula
0 to 60 percent grad rate	CGR x 1.166667
61 to 100 percent grad rate	(CGR x 2.0) – 50

Cohort Graduation Indices: Strength of Diploma Index

The *strength of diploma index* (25% of SPS) assigns points to students based on their exit status. The points of all cohort members are averaged to produce the index.

Quality of Diploma (Graduation Index): Student Results (2014-15 Graduates)	Points Awarded
HS Diploma plus*	150
(a) AP score of 3 or higher, IB score of 4 or higher, or CLEP score of 50 or higher; OR

Cohort Graduation Data Certification

Data Certification

- The Department is conducting certification of the 2014-2015 cohort data used to calculate the graduation rate and strength of diploma indices from March 14 through April 4, 2016.
- School-level student rosters will be available through the LA Data Review online system. The rosters will include the following:
 - Student enrollment history
 - Dates for graduation or other exit types
 - AP, IB, Dual Enrollment, IBC, and HiSET/GED earnings
 - Fifth- and sixth-year graduates

IMPORTANT: This is the **final** opportunity for districts to requests changes to these data before the graduation rate and strength of diploma indices are calculated for the 2016 SPS.

Exit Code Review

- In conjunction with cohort graduation data certification, some student records are randomly selected from the cohort graduation file for review of documentation used to apply the exit codes for
 - out of state transfer,
 - transfer to nonpublic school, or
 - transfer to a home study program.
- Districts/schools are required to provide documentation through the LA Data Review online system for students included on the exit code review rosters that will be posted to the FTP prior to the opening of LA Data Review.

Cohort Graduation Data Review: Louisiana Data Review Online System

The Department distributes rosters via a web-based system known as Louisiana (LA) Data Review.

Accountability contacts will

- receive an email with user ID, password, and user guides;
- download and distribute rosters to schools for review;
- request data changes using individual student edit screens within the system;
- submit requests for changes to the 2014-2015 cohort graduation rosters;
- download the exit code review roster from the FTP; and
- upload documentation into LA Data Review for students on the exit code review roster.

The CLEP test scores for 2014-2015 graduation cohort members were not available for the rosters that are posted in the Louisiana Data Review. The LDOE will automatically update the *strength of diploma index* data with the College Board file when data certification closes. A CLEP verification file will be sent to all districts for which changes to the index.

Measuring Student Success: Technology Support

2016-2017 E-Rate Application

The E-Rate application window for schools to apply for discounts on telecommunication services and hardware is now open. LEAs and schools need to complete all steps to ensure their application is submitted on time. All applications for 2016-2017 must be filed within the <u>E-Rate Productivity</u> <u>Center</u> (EPC) portal.

- The E-Rate application portal requires much more information than in the past; therefore, districts should allow at least twice the amount of time to file.
- Do not wait until the deadlines.
- USAC is updating the EPC portals and forms weekly throughout the filing window.
- All communication from USAC to applicants will come through the EPC Portal versus through email; therefore, LEAs should ensure all contact information is correct.

District Discount Validation File:

- USAC has required each state to submit a discount validation file verifying the entity eligibility, student demographic information, and school/district relationships for determining E-Rate funding and district discounts.
- LEA technology directors and E-Rate contacts received an email with their entity validation information in a spreadsheet last week.
- LEAs should verify whether all information is accurate in their spreadsheet and send feedback to EdTech@la.gov.

Early Childhood

Accountability: Changes for 2016-2017

Much progress has been made during the learning year:

- 98% of toddler and pre-K classrooms were observed in the fall
- Communities are currently running coordinated enrollment for 2016-2017

The current challenge is to build a fair and accurate rating system that honors excellence in age-appropriate instruction:

- Performance—What are our shared expectations for classroom instruction?
- Differentiation—How do we communicate differences in what children are experiencing?
- *Growth*—How much should classrooms improve year after year, and how do we encourage improvement?
- Accuracy—How do we ensure consistent and accurate observations statewide?

The Department will seek statewide input on proposed changes for 2016-2017:

- The state will release proposed changes to Bulletin 140 via webinar on April 13.
- From April 13 to 29, the state will conduct in-person sessions to solicit feedback statewide.
- The lead agency application will be released on April 13 and will indicate funding available for observations, enrollment, and administration.
- A webinar link and materials will be released via upcoming early childhood newsletters.

Engaging Teachers and Families

The state will release two separate surveys in April to engage families and teachers.

In partnership with United Way and LSU, the state will conduct a survey of families:

- The survey will include sample of families from all types of publicly funded early childhood, including child care, Head Start, and school-based pre-K.
- Families will have the opportunity to provide their input on how well their programs serve their children, whether they would choose those programs again, and how satisfied they are with their community's enrollment process.
- The Department will distribute surveys to programs in April.
- Results will be reported back for informational purposes only at the community network level and will **not** be included as part of site or network rating.

The state will also survey early childhood teachers to understand how satisfied teachers are:

- An online survey will assess teacher perception on how well they are supported by their community network to prepare children for kindergarten.
- Results will be reported back for informational purposes only at the community network level and will **not** be included as part of site or network rating.
