


We are also grateful that the Governor's Office of Homeland Security and Emergency Preparedness (GOHSEP) and FEMA are working closely with impacted districts to address facility needs and expedite assistance to school employees who were displaced from their homes. Disaster Recovery Process: Student Enrollment

- In order better account for the mobility of and funding for displaced students, the
 Department has determined a process to capture a snapshot of student enrollment prior
 to the official October 1 student count.
- LEA data coordinators have received a request to report to the LDOE Student Information System (SIS) by September 30 all students enrolled in the LEA on September 16.
- The September 16 snapshot is the only additional count scheduled, however, the
 Department may request additional count dates throughout the fall to measure student
 movement.
- The MFP count date of October 1 is written into the formula and cannot be changed without BESE and legislative approval. The additional snapshot counts will only be used to recognize the impact of the flooding on student enrollment.

Teaching and Learning: Believe and Prepare

Believe and Prepare Policy Development and Timeline

Believe and Prepare pilot leaders, as well as academic research, reveal promising practices in teacher licensure and preparation that could be the basis for long-term, statewide policy.

These policies, described below, have been under discussion for the past two years with district and preparation leaders, and are undergoing additional research before BESE's consideration.

Two motions were approved by BESE and BoR at their June meeting:

- Motion 1 endorsed a gradual, year-over-year shift to competency-based teacher preparation
 programs that incorporate full-year residencies, and charged BESE and BoR with conducting a
 fiscal impact study of these shifts.
 - Six preparation providers and their district partners participated in the fiscal impact study.
 - A report on this fiscal impact study will be available in mid-September.
- Motion 2 endorsed the development and implementation of updated policies relative to the initial and ongoing approval of teacher preparation programs, and charged BESE and BoR with forming a workgroup to guide the development of these policies.

- The workgroup has been formed and will begin meeting in October.

Believe and Prepare Policy Development and Timeline


To be considered by BESE in October:

- Preparation program experience descriptors, including a gradual shift to competencybased program designs and yearlong residencies for all teacher candidates.
- Teacher licensure policies, including the formation of a workgroup to research and recommend, if appropriate, adoption of updated pedagogy assessments and content knowledge assessments aligned to Louisiana Student Standards.

To be considered by BESE in the 2016-2017 school year, and guided by the workgroup charged by BESE and BOR:

Preparation program approval policies, including a multi-measure, Higher Education
 Act-compliant quality rating system with comparable measures for both traditional and
 alternative providers to be phased in over six years.

K-3 Assessments: Accessing DSC Data

- The Department is piloting K-readiness assessments this school year, as 2016-2017 is the last year LEAs are required to use the DSC for kindergarten screening.
- In October, the Department will move away from utilizing the <u>DSC web application</u> for data management, and will conclude covering the cost for use of the web application.
- The DSC web application will be available throughout October. LEAs will be able to
 access the DSC system and retrieve student data and reports until October 31, 2016.
- After October 31, 2016, LEAs that wish to retrieve their data will be able to do so by submitting a request to Red-e-Set Grow before the end of the 2016-2017 school year.

LEAP 2025: ELA and Math RFP Update

Louisiana's spring 2017 LEAP assessments build on the baseline LEAP assessments from the past three years, building a first-class comprehensive assessment system. Over time the system will include:

- Grades 3-8 ELA and Math assessments, aligned to LA student standards and similar in design to the 2016 spring tests
- A transition from four- to five-level EOC English I, English II, Algebra I, and Geometry tests, aligned to LA student standards over the next couple of years
- K-2 formative tasks that will reflect and eventually expand on the approach and content of the K-2 Guidebook
- Diagnostic assessments that can help teachers determine what students can do and where students need support (available in 2017-2018)
- Interim assessments districts can use to check student progress on essential ELA and Math skills

LEAP 2025: U.S. History EOC

- The US History End-of-Course (EOC) test continues to assess the US History grade-level expectations (GLEs), which were revised by committees of Louisiana educators during the 2010–2011 school year.
- The structure of the test remains the same as it was in previous administrations.
- The 2016-2017 EOC tests will be administered in DRC's online system (same system used in last year's Spring 2016 LEAP computer-based tests).
- U.S. History EOC will include embedded field test items.

Louisiana's Assessment System: Non-Summative Assessments

Non-Summative Assessments

The Department will provide school systems with the following resources to support the use of non-summative assessment practices during the transition to new standards and state assessments:

- high quality assessment questions;
- meaningful information on student performance throughout the school year; and
- access to the same formative systems and processes they will utilize for the summative assessments.

Non-Summative Assessments Goals and Priorities

The Department's goal is to acquire and/or develop high-quality summative and non-summative assessments that

- 1. align to Louisiana Student Standards;
- 2. provide a complete picture of student learning, which includes access to;
 - a. Grade 3-HS diagnostic assessments,
 - b. Grade 3-HS interim assessments,
 - c. Ongoing classroom assessments (EAGLE 2.0 and K-2 Formative Tasks),
 - d. Annual state/district summative assessments, and
- provide districts and schools with access to one system to deliver all summative and non-summative assessments.

EAGLE 2.0 Transition

In August, the Department began conducting quality control checks to ensure that EAGLE questions were transferred and rendered correctly in the new platform.



Louisiana's Assessment System: Technology Readiness

Transitioning to Technology

In 2016–2017 grades 3–8 will complete the transition to computer-based tests, with a paper option remaining for grades 3 and 4. End-of-Course (EOC) exams will also move to this same platform. A smooth transition to online testing requires that a number of factors be addressed within schools and districts. These factors fall within three main work streams: digital literacy, technology readiness, and assessment administration preparation.

This training provides an opportunity for teachers and students to become familiar with the online testing tools (e.g., highlighter, magnification, etc.) that are available in the testing platform.

Additionally the OTT:

- may be reviewed as many times as desired;
- is not to be considered representative of an actual test;
- is available once Insight is installed or by <u>link</u> using Google Chrome browser;
- is now available for grades 3-8
- will be available for EOCs in September.





Lead Agency Specific Track at the Supervisor Collaborations


- The Early Childhood team will continue to offer sessions on conducting observations, coordinating enrollment and ensuring effective communication with all programs.

Financial Aid Working Group: Summary Report

Over 40 participants from across the state representing local education agencies, higher education, non-profits, government agencies, financial aid service providers, and others presented a <u>study group report</u> to BESE, which focused on assisting the LDOE with implementing the financial aid access policy approved by the Board in December 2015.

The report focused on:

- 1. developing a state action plan for school level financial aid form completion;
- assisting the Department in the ongoing identification of support services and programs available for secondary schools and families; and
- 3. assisting in the development of partnerships with financial aid-related support programs, services, and other stakeholders.

Financial Aid Working Group: Final Recommendations and Next Steps

- **Recommendation 1:** Inform students and families about financial aid eligibility and opportunities throughout students' high school career
- **Recommendation 2:** Ensure financial aid planning support services are consistently updated and accessible for students and their families
- **Recommendation 3:** Stakeholders should foster meaningful partnerships that leverage the unique competencies of each group and provide families and communities with financial aid assistance specifically tailored to their needs

NEXT STEPS:

- The Louisiana Department of Education has reviewed the recommendations and has taken or plans to take steps to address each.
- The Louisiana Department of Education will publish, "The State of Financial Aid in Louisiana," an annual report that will show the rate of financial aid completion amongst high school seniors, and highlight those districts and individual schools with the highest completion rates.

2016-17 SCA/Course Choice


The Supplemental Course Allocation (SCA) provides districts and public schools an MFP allocation related to the cost of high school credit courses. The allocation is individualized to the needs of secondary students and is provided outside the traditional secondary school.

The deadline to report Course Choice enrollments has been extended to September 26. LEAs in the Capital region affected by the flood should reach out to SCA@la.gov for individual assistance with the registration process.
