Appendix A: Priority Schools

BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE

Louisiana students are just as smart and capable as any in America. Louisiana has acted on this belief by raising academic expectations for students. To help students succeed in the classroom and beyond, Louisiana has also raised the bar for teaching excellence, as research has long indicated that quality of classroom teaching is a major factor in increasing student achievement. For this reason, strengthening teacher preparation programs has been a major focus in Louisiana over the last decade.

As the work of Louisiana's teachers continues to evolve, teacher preparation must continue to evolve so as to better prepare the next generation of teachers. A recent survey of new teachers, the programs preparing them, and the school systems hiring them provided valuable insight into the challenges and opportunities in current teacher preparation.

Embracing Opportunities through Believe and Prepare

Recruiting and training the next generation of teachers is one of the first steps a school system can take to ensure that new teachers are classroom ready, every classroom is staffed by an effective teacher, and all students are on a successful path to college and career. Through the **Believe and Prepare: Educator Preparation Grants**, 35 school systems and 19 preparation providers have developed partnerships to achieve this vision. These pilot programs have focused on:

- Providing aspiring teachers with more time to practice alongside exceptional mentor teachers through yearlong apprenticeships and residencies
- Strengthening partnerships between school systems and preparation programs so that schools' staffing needs are met and coursework is based on what it takes to succeed in Louisiana classrooms

The pilots have also identified a critical priority that deserves greater focus: *defining and elevating the role of the mentor teacher.* Mentor teachers serve in one of the most important leadership roles in the education profession—training and developing the next generation of teachers. Reshaping the role of the mentor teacher is a fundamental step toward ensuring that aspiring teachers learn from the State's best teachers, those who consistently demonstrate a positive impact on student learning and lead their fellow teachers by example. Thus, in order to provide quality yearlong residencies for *all* aspiring teachers, school systems and their preparation provider partners must work together to recruit, select, and develop a highly skilled and committed cadre of mentor teachers.

Believe and Prepare Cohort 3 – Request for Applications

The Department is now requesting applications for the third cohort of Believe and Prepare. This third cohort of Believe and Prepare will enable school systems and their preparation program partners to reshape the role of the mentor teacher and expand extended practice opportunities.

In Cohort 3, the Department is calling on school systems and their preparation provider partners to:

- Build cadres of exceptional mentor teachers by formalizing the mentor teacher role, including:
 - o Identifying mentor teachers based on their results with students
 - Defining the role of the mentor teacher in both new teacher preparation and district instructional leadership experiences
 - Providing mentor teachers with a program of professional learning and support
- Meet schools' instructional needs by:
 - Substantially increasing the number of aspiring teachers participating in a yearlong residency
 - Building teacher leadership and teacher development expertise in <u>priority schools</u>
 - o Increasing the number of **special education teachers** preparing to teach in Louisiana
- Collaborate to identify and expand promising teacher preparation practices by
 - Participating in research to strengthen policy and practice relative to mentor teacher identification and training
 - Formally sharing their learning by leading and participating in Believe and Prepare community meetings, developing and sharing tools, and providing direct coaching and consultation to other Believe and Prepare community members.

These grants will be funded in part by Title I School Improvement 1003a funds, which must be used to support school improvement in <u>priority schools</u> (See Appendix A). Grants to support special education teacher preparation will funded by federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) funds.

Prior grantees from Cohorts 1 and 2 are eligible to apply.

I. PROGRAM PRIORITIES

1. Mentor Teacher Recruitment and Development*

School systems, independently or in partnership with preparation providers, develop a new vision for the role of the mentor teacher. At the end of the grant period, the grantee will have identified and developed a cadre of mentor teachers who are demonstrably prepared to work with growing numbers of teacher candidates and practicing teachers, and who have a defined role with respect to new teacher development. This is accomplished through the following:

- Recruitment of mentor teachers based on demonstrated impact on all students' learning and ability to coach adults
- The creation of a defined role for the mentor teacher with respect to: new teacher development, school- and district-based instructional leadership
- Formalizing the role and status of the mentor teacher through school system position advancement and/or through recognition in partner institutions as adjunct or clinical faculty
- Implementation of a program of profession support and development for mentors, accomplished by working with a partner with proven experience in this area, such as but not limited to: Leading Educators, National Institute for Excellence in Teaching, or St. Cloud State University (co-teaching model)
- Providing mentors with the opportunity to directly support teacher candidates and/or new teachers in the 2015-16 school year
- Assessment of mentor teachers' success at year-end, including development of criteria for success

2. Residency* Design and Preparation

School systems partner with preparation providers to develop full-scale residency-based programs (i.e., with virtually all program participants) that impact priority schools. At the end of the grant period, the grantee will have designed and will be prepared to launch a full-year residency for virtually all participants in a complete pathway or the majority of programs in a pathway. The grantee will have identified and developed a cadre of mentor teachers who are demonstrably prepared to work with incoming residents. This is accomplished through the following:

- Preparation of residency settings
 - Development of formalized partnerships with priority schools
 - Identification and development of mentor teachers (see priority one) who are prepared to collaborate with and support teacher residents
 - Development and pilot of system for principals, provider faculty, and mentor teachers to assess residents' teaching knowledge and skill through performance
- Design of residency programs
 - Transformation of course sequences and practice experiences into a coherent program of study
 - Unification of practicum and student teaching into a full-year residency

3. Special Education**

School systems partner with preparation providers to develop Believe and Prepare programs that increase the number of certified special education teachers and strengthen the preparation experience through mentoring and/or full-year residency programs as described above. Applicants who propose to develop low-incidence disability teacher preparation programs (Hearing impaired Grades K-12, Visual Impairments/Blind Grades K-12, Significant Disabilities Grades 1-12) may be eligible for increased funds to support program start-up.

^{*}Applicants responding to priorities 1 and 2 must demonstrate how programs support school improvement in **priority schools** (See Appendix A) during the 2015-2016 academic years.

^{**}Applicants responding to priority 3 must demonstrate how programs support special education teachers and instruction during the 2015-2016 academic year.

IV. CRITERIA AND EVALUATION

Applications will be assessed on the below criteria.

Program Design

- Program design centers on mentor teacher development as an essential component of successful teacher preparation residency implementation.
- Program includes a plan to formalize the mentor teacher role and assess mentor success.
- Program design clearly addresses one or more of the priorities listed in Section I.
- School and/or school system leaders play a lead role in program design and implementation.

Program Outcomes

- Program includes a plan for impacting school improvement in priority schools.
- Program identifies concrete indicators of success on an ambitious and reasonable timeline.
- If focused on priority three, program sets measurable outcomes for impacts on special education teacher success.

Program Sustainability and Expansion Plan

- Budget uses grant funds to support highest impact activities.
- Application describes a concrete plan to sustain the program beyond the grant period.
- Application describes a plan and timeline to expand the program beyond the grant period.

V. ELIGIBILITY AND FUNDING

The Department will award Believe and Prepare grants of up to \$200,000 to any of the following institutions that present a high-quality and innovative proposal that meets the criteria in Sections I and IV:

- School system
- Individual school or group of schools
- A partnership between a school system or school(s) and a preparation provider.

Partnerships can include any number of schools, school systems, and/or new or existing preparation providers. Partnerships should submit one, joint application. Signatories on the application should include the school principal, with superintendent or CEO letter of support; and/or superintendent/CEO; and preparation program head or chair or university campus head or designee, if applicable.

While the lead school or school system on the application will serve as the grant award recipient, the lead school or school system may sub-grant to or contract with a collaborating preparation provider and/or vendor.
