In October, **BESE adopted updated policies** for the preparation of aspiring teachers which include:

- A yearlong classroom residency alongside an experienced mentor teacher
- A competency-based curriculum that provides candidates with the knowledge and skills needed for their first day of teaching.


By July 2018, teacher preparation programs in Louisiana will include a yearlong classroom residency alongside an experienced mentor teacher.

Welcome and Overview

Schools, school systems, and the state now turn their attention toward scaling the Believe and Prepare model into full, statewide implementation over the next three years.

Last month, BESE approved more \$1.5 million in formula-based grant awards for Louisiana universities and school systems to advance the statewide shift to full-year residencies for all aspiring teachers.

Next month, BESE will consider another round of grants to support accelerated design and essential, unique, high-cost needs that must be met in order to successfully transition programs to obtain BESE approval.

Believe and Prepare Residency Expansion Grant

In response to provider and district leaders' feedback and in light of workforce needs across the state, the Department will solicit applications for funding to support:

- Teacher preparation providers that work closely with and place yearlong teaching residents in rural schools and districts participating in the Teacher Incentive Fund (TIF) grant
- Post-baccalaureate teacher preparation residencies that provide co-teaching opportunities
- Teacher preparation programs that increase the number of effective special education teachers

*Priority will be given to application that increase the number of secondary math and science teachers.

Priority 1: Meeting the needs of rural districts

Establish fiscally sustainable teacher preparation pipelines that **increase the number of effective teachers in rural school districts participating in the TIF grant**. Proposals may include:

- Undergraduate residency satellite sites
- Multi-district alternate residency partnerships
- Alternate preparation pathways for paraprofessionals or long-term substitutes

Priority 2: Post-baccalaureate residencies

Establish fiscally sustainable **post-baccalaureate teacher preparation residencies that provide co-teaching opportunities**, to increase the number of effective teachers in high-need schools, districts, and/or certification areas.



Priority 3: Meeting the needs of students with special needs

Establish fiscally sustainable teacher preparation pipelines that increase the number of effective special education teachers

- Integrated to merged Birth-K/Early Interventionist programs
- 1-5, 4-8, 6-12 integrated to merged programs
- Low-incidence disabilities special education teacher preparation programs



Minimum Criteria

For all competitive priorities, applications must describe plans that include, but not be limited to, the following activities:

- Co-construct competency-based preparation programs that include, at minimum, a yearlong residency
- Select, develop, and evaluate highly effective mentor teachers
- Select and develop high-quality residency host school sites
- Provide direct coaching and support to teacher residents and mentor teachers
- Establish **partnership governance teams** who routinely evaluate candidate, mentor, and program effectiveness to make continuous improvement

Priority will be given to proposals that include partnership with at least one TIF district.



Application and Grant Timeline

The Department will award Believe and Prepare grants of up to \$250,000 per year to BESE-approved teacher preparation providers that present a high-quality and innovative proposal that meets the priorities identified in the Request for Applications.
