## **Literacy Myth Buster: Handwriting**

**Myth:** Handwriting does not need to be explicitly taught. Students can just type.

Truth: Consistent practice strengthens connections between phonemes (sounds) and graphemes (letters), building fluency over time. Explicit handwriting instruction, including cursive writing, supports letter-sound mapping, orthographic memory, and word recognition, especially for students with dyslexia. Research shows handwriting activates brain regions involved in reading in ways that typing alone does not. Handwriting fluency also frees up cognitive space for comprehension and higher-level thinking.

## Implementing Quality High-Dosage Tutoring

- School System HDT Plans were due September 15 in eGMS and may still be submitted. Plans must be approved by December 15 to receive funds. Funds will be released upon plan approval.
- Schedules, selection and training of tutors, student eligibility determinations, and materials selection should be completed.
- This year, there should be a focus on quality of the tutoring sessions including the connection between core content and tutoring content and the impact of the tutoring lesson on student learning.



## **High-Dosage Tutoring Outcome-Based Contracts**

School systems may soon apply for additional Accelerate: HDT funds to extend high-dosage tutoring through outcome-based contracts (OBCs). OBCs must be with existing external partners and will support an additional 10-week tutoring cycle.

## **BOY K-3 Literacy Gifted Referral Data Collection**

Louisiana Statute 17:24.9 mandates districts to report the number of students identified for referral for gifted evaluation for every literacy screening administration for Kindergarten through Grade 3.

The following data sets will be collected for each grade level:

- The number of gifted students scoring in the above-average range on the literacy screener
- The number of non-gifted students referred for additional screening
- The number of non-gifted students referred for gifted evaluation

BOY reporting is due **October 13**.



## **Annual Dyslexia Reporting**

School systems are required to annually report the number of students with dyslexia currently enrolled and the number of students newly identified with dyslexia in the prior school year.

The dyslexia reporting form will open in October. All school systems must submit the dyslexia reporting form by **December 15**.

Dyslexia reporting guidance is available in the Students with Disabilities Library.



### October 1 IDEA Collection - Child Count

The LDOE is required to annually report the number of students with disabilities receiving special education and related services on the state's child count date (October 1).

To be included in the official child count, a student must have the following:

- Current evaluation as of October 1
- Current IEP as of October 1
- Receiving services as of October 1



### October 1 Collection - Child Count

### Reports to run to verify data:

- Counted and Not Counted
- IDEA Child Count Summary
- Federal Evaluation Listing and Summary
- FAPE Placement
- SIS/SER Cross Check and Cross Check IDEA Count

Review common issues with the count on the <u>eSER FAQ</u>. Individual LASID inquiries can be sent to <u>LDOE Data System Support</u>. The official child count will run on **October 22 at 6 p.m**.

### October 1 Collection - SPED Personnel

The LDOE is also required to annually report the number of special education and related services personnel on the state's child count date (October 1).

Reports to run to verify data:

- Personnel Detail and Summary
- Service Listing

SPED Personnel data must be accurate for official IDEA child count.



## SPED Reporting - Annual SPP/APR Monitoring

To prepare for annual monitoring outreach, school systems should run the following reports for 2024-2025 to identify any noncompliance:

- Discipline Reports
- SPP Indicator 11 Report
- Part C Transition Report



# **Educator Talent and Workforce Development**



### LES 2024-2025 Closeout Reminders

- Systems should continue finalizing educator evaluations for the 2024-2025 school year. Evaluations (including VAM teachers) may be finalized if all required components are complete.
- Evaluations should be marked incomplete for any employee that did not receive an evaluation. Refer to <u>Bulletin 130</u> for the conditions that allow an evaluation to be marked incomplete.
- The deadline for entering educator evaluation data will be announced after VAM results are available this fall.



### **LES Updates for 2025-2026**

- Systems are encouraged to begin setting SLTs and conducting observations.
- In accordance with **Bulletin 130**, evaluators and evaluatees must meet to discuss SLTs.
- The LES Timeline and the LES Technical Guide are resources available for this process.



### **LEADS Implementation On-Site Sessions**

<u>LEADS Implementation On-Site Sessions</u> are being offered across the state.

- Upcoming sessions are being offered in Jackson, Grant, Winn, St. Landry, Concordia, Evangeline, Iberia, Pointe Coupee, St. John the Baptist, Terrebonne, and St. James.
- Sessions focus on the <u>formal observation process</u> and cycle of support.
- System and school leaders are encouraged to register.
