Assessment and Accountability: Spring Testing

• Students must take assessments to be included in final grades for all assessment-eligible courses (Algebra I, Geometry, English I, English II, Biology and U.S.History). The assessment score will carry a weight of 15-30% for regular education students and 5% for students with disabilities.

New Geometry Requirement

Students who take Applied Geometry as part of the new policy for students earning a diploma under the Jump Start diploma pathway, beginning in 2023-2024 must take the Geometry assessment. Students must pass either Algebra I or Geometry to meet the math pair assessment requirement.

There is only <u>one Geometry assessment</u> for courses that satisfy the Math requirement (no separate LEAP test for Applied Geometry).

Graduation dates may be removed (in red and scratched out) from a student STS transcript due to the following reasons:

PLEASE REMEMBER:

A graduate in STS without a graduation date is not a Louisiana graduate (even if there is a grad date in your local system).

Code	Problem	Solution
2	23 credits	Not having 23 credits Student does not have at least 23 credits. Check transcripts and course part numbers.

Individual Graduation Planning

What is the purpose of an IGP?

To ensure the student's plans for high school and beyond align with available options and future goal. The development of the IGP plan involves reviewing an interest inventory, school and state specific information, including high school graduation requirements, high school course options, and postsecondary education and training programs.

An IGP initiates in the 8th grade and connects a student's present academic progress and its relevance to future education and/or employment.

Cohort Graduation Data Certification

The Department plans to open data certification for the 2022 graduation cohort on March 1.

School systems should complete the following steps in advance of this certification period:

• Check for a graduation date on the official transcript in the STS. No student will be counted as a graduate without a complete and dated transcript. School systems will be required to correct the transcript in STS during data certification before any changes are approved.

• Check to make sure all students who earned a diploma through the Jump Start Career Diploma Alternate Pathway have taken all three LEAP Connect subject tests at the high school level. Students are not eligible for this pathway without full participation in LEAP Connect.

Cohort Graduation Data Certification

The Department plans to open data certification for the 2022 graduation cohort on March 1.

School systems should complete the following steps in advance of this certification period:

• Check for Jump Start credentials earned by cohort members. To earn points for credentials in the strength of diploma index, credentials must be correctly recorded on the transcripts. During data certification, school systems will be required to correct the transcripts in STS before any changes are approved.

• Organize a process for collecting documentation for exit code 10 (out of state), exit code 14 (transfer to approved nonpublic school) and exit code 16 (BESE-approved home study). Students who were exited with one of these codes and who do not have documentation will be changed to nongraduates.

Revised Academic Affairs Policy 2.22 (Minimum Requirements for Dual Enrollment) At its January 2023 meeting the Board of Regents approved the revisions of the Minimum Requirements for Dual Enrollment at public postsecondary institutions.

This newly approved policy makes permanent the previously interim dual enrollment policy and provides additional expanded pathways for eligibility.

- The <u>Louisiana ACT® Now</u> initiative program provided funding to purchase prebilled registration ACT test vouchers for eligible students in grades 12 and 10 as described in this application. This expanded opportunities for students to take the exam to assist them with reaching their educational goals.

Fast Forward

Fast Forward is a program which will allow students to earn either a Jump Start TOPS Tech Career Diploma or a TOPS University Diploma while dually earning an associate degree or participating in a <u>Louisiana Workforce Commission registered pre-apprenticeship or apprenticeship</u> that either prepares graduates for career or continuing postsecondary education.

In this program, students spend the majority of grades 9 and 10 on the high school campus earning core graduation requirements. In grades 11 and 12 they spend the majority of time on the postsecondary campus or Board of Regents approved satellite site dually enrolled in courses to complete graduation requirements as well as earning an associate degree or participating in a pre-apprenticeship/apprenticeship opportunity.

OVERVIEW

The Health Science Jump Start 2.0 Pathway prepares students to recognize, assess, diagnose, treat, and manage patient and medical needs in pre-hospital, disaster, hospital, medical office, and/or home health care settings. Students in this pathway study basic, intermediate, and advanced EMT procedures; emergency surgical procedures; medical triage; rescue operations; crisis scene management and personnel supervision; equipment operation and maintenance; patient stabilization, monitoring, and care; drug administration; identification and preliminary diagnosis of diseases and injuries; communication and computer operations; basic anatomy, physiology, pathology, and toxicology; professional standards and regulations. This pathway exposes students to occupations in biotechnology research and development, diagnostic services, health informatics, support services, and therapeutic services in private businesses, industry, community organizations, and health care facilities. This pathway also equips students to have careers in allied health services that are preemptive and centered on wellness.

COLLEGE AND CAREER CONNECTIONS

Finding high-wage career opportunities directly out of high school can be challenging. It typically requires advanced capstone credentials accompanied by work experience and/or apprenticeships in the field.

SCA/Course Choice Reporting

- The <u>SCA Portal</u> is open for Spring reporting for dual enrollment courses with Public Higher Education Providers. The deadline to report these courses is **March 10**.
- School systems should be receiving invoices from SCA Private Providers and/or SCA Public Higher Education Providers. Once invoices are received, school systems are to cross referencing invoices with enrollment data that has been reported in the SCA Portal. If there are any discrepancies, please contact Sca@la.gov to amend any necessary information.
- The finance contact from each school system is encouraged to have access to the portal. If any of them do not, have them email sca@la.gov.
- After March 10, the reallocation process begins and there will not be any late submissions.

Jump Start Summers

The <u>Jump Start Summers program</u> will be available to launch summer training sessions for students to earn Carnegie credit aligned to Fast Forward pathways, Jump Start 2.0 coursework, statewide basic or advanced credentials, participate in work-based learning and earn a student stipend for participation.

The <u>application</u> to submit as a prospective or returning Jump Start Summers provider is now open. The application will close on **March 13 at 5 p.m.** The encumbered Supplemental Course Allocation (SCA dollars can be used for this opportunity.
