## What is ASVAB CEP?

The ASVAB Career Exploration Program (CEP) is a comprehensive, **no cost**, **no commitment** career planning resource designed to help young people align their strengths and interests with a post-secondary plan that works.

Students in grades 10-12 and first/second year post-secondary are encouraged to participate.




## What is ASVAB CEP?

#### Three key components:

- •Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) the most widely-used multiple aptitude test battery in the world measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success.
- •Find Your Interests (FYI) a 90-item interest inventory designed to help students identify their work-related interests.
- •OCCU-Find this career catalog contains data related to 100s of careers with activities to help students put a plan together.

## Participant Intentions

The goal of the ASVAB CEP is to enable students to explore a variety of careers related to their skills and interests, rather than limit their exploration by telling them what they can or should do.

# ASVAB CEP Information for Educators

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## What is a Registered Apprenticeship

Registered-Apprenticeship On the Job Trainings are work-based activities where students work with an employer directly aligned to their pathways to gain real-world, hands-on experience to strengthen skills learned during classroom instruction. The student should be fully immersed in the work experience with support from an industry supervisor to work towards mastering skills. An apprenticeship agreement is set up prior to the experience that outlines the expected objectives to be accomplished by the student.

## **Advantages of Registered Apprenticeships**

## **Advantages of Registered Apprenticeships**

#### Industry Demand and Skilled Shortages

- Many of the industries that offer Registered Apprenticeships, such as construction, advanced manufacturing, information technology, and healthcare, are experiencing significant labor shortages and are willing to offer higher wages to skilled workers.
- Workers with apprenticeship training often command premium wages due to the shortage of qualified candidates.

#### Reduced Student Loan Debt

Apprenticeships offer the opportunity to earn a wage while learning on the job,
 which reduces or eliminates the need for student loans

## What is an Internship

Under Louisiana's Work-Based Learning policy, an internship is a structured, supervised work experience that provides high school students with meaningful, hands-on learning in a real-world work environment.

Some of the requirements under the policy are that the experience is

- **Structured & Supervised** Must include clear learning objectives and regular oversight.
- Career-Aligned Relevant to the student's career interests and pathway.
- **Employer Mentorship** Provides guidance and feedback to support student development.
- Documentation Regular progress reports and evaluations from employers.
- Compliance with Labor Laws Adheres to child labor laws and fair work practices.
- Paid Experience Internships should be compensated, as unpaid internships do not qualify.

## **Advantages of Internships**

- Hands-On Experience Develops practical skills in a real-world work environment.
- Career Identity Helps students discover who they are as employees
- Workplace Readiness Builds essential, durable skills
- **Networking Opportunities** Connects students with industry professionals for mentorship and future job prospects.
- Paid Work Under the new work-based learning policy, internships offer compensation, helping students earn while they learn.
- Exposure to Industry Standards Familiarizes students with workplace expectations, technologies, and best practices.
- Pathway to Employment Often leads to job offers or apprenticeships

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## **Application to Employ Minors Form**

Students between 14 and 17 years old, need to complete the <u>Application to Employ Minors Form</u>, which is required for obtaining an employment certificate. Be aware that there are certain hourly restrictions for minors, so it's important to discuss these with the issuing officer at your school district.

- Students participating in an internship require a CTE Minor Employment Form, which uses the same application and is issued by the Certifying Officer.
- The Certifying Officer must be either the school's work-based learning teacher or its Career and Technical Education (CTE) teacher.

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# Benefits of Focusing DE programs on Certificate of Technical Studies Programs in High Wage/High Demand Sectors

A Certificate of Technical Studies (CTS) is a postsecondary credential focused on industry-specific skills for high-wage, high-demand fields. These programs are typically comprised of 16-33 credit hours that provide hands-on training and align with workforce needs, helping students transition directly into careers. CTS's can also function as an on-or-off ramp, so if a student is ready to enter the workforce after the CTS is earned, they're able to do so, but the student can also continue towards more advanced credentials such a Technical Diploma or Associate of Applied Science degree, as CTS's are embedded within those diplomas.

# Benefits of Focusing DE programs on Certificate of Technical Studies Programs in High Wage/High Demand Sectors

- **Supports Workforce Development Goals**: Better aligns secondary education with regional initiatives to build a skilled workforce.
- Meets Labor Market Needs: Early access to training for in-demand industries.
- **Enhances Student Engagement**: Motivates students by connecting education to real-world career opportunities.
- Maximizes Educational Resources: Invests in programs with strong employment outcomes.
- Boosts Economic Growth: Attracts businesses and strengthens the state economy.
- Increases Student Earning Potential: Leads to higher wages and career advancement.

# Strengthening Course Progressions through College-LEA Collaboration

- **Strategic Partnerships with LEAs**: Collaborate to develop intentional course progressions aligned with career pathways and regional workforce needs.
- Integration of SCA Offerings: Intentionally incorporate Supplemental Course Academy (SCA) offerings to enhance student readiness and ensure seamless transitions.

## Communicating CTS Alignment and Supporting Student Transitions

- Clear Communication of CTS Programs: Articulate that course offerings are part of a Certificate of Technical Studies (CTS).
- Alignment with CTC, TD, and AAS Credentials: Demonstrate how Career and Technical Certificates (CTC), Technical Diplomas (TD), and Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degrees align with CTS pathways.
- Transitional Support for CTS Graduates: Offer career counseling, job placement assistance, and inform about further education opportunities, such as transitioning to TD or AAS programs.
- Maximizing Impact on Success and Accountability: Emphasize that a CTC graduates a student, while a CTS contributes to system accountability points, benefiting both students and institutions.
