 - Advanced Placement (AP)
 - International Baccalaureate (IB)
 - Gifted and Talented (GT)
 - Dual Enrollment (DE)
- Specific course codes will ensure that schools are rewarded appropriately in the accountability system for 2014-15 freshman cohart

Note: In order to meet the current <u>TOPS Tech requirement</u> students will need to complete an additional 3rd unit of science, 3rd unit of social studies, and a credit in a basic computer course. (The LDOE will be working with the Legislature during the next session in an attempt to harmonize the requirements of Jump Start and TOPS Tech.)

A student shall complete a regionally-designed, district-implemented series of Career and Technical Education Jump Start coursework and workplace-based learning experiences leading to a statewide or regional Jump Start credential. Each student's Jump Start graduation pathway shall include courses and workplace experiences specific to the credential, courses related to foundational career skills requirements, and other courses (including career electives) that the Jump Start regional team determines are appropriate for the career pathway.

²One credit of Civics may be substituted for any two of the one-half credit Social Studies courses specified

Transcripts

- Course Choice/SCA provides schools with courses not available on the school campus, avoiding duplication of courses
- Course Choice/SCA final grades must be recorded on the student's transcript by school-appointed authority
 - Course grades are calculated and posted by Course Choice/SCA providers
 - School counselors download grades from the counselor's dashboard
 - Schools report and transcribe grades

Counselor Assistance Center

- The Course Choice/SCA Counselor Assistance Center (CAC) is responsible for helping professional school counselors, students and family members successfully participate in the Supplemental Course Academy. Their responsibility entails:
 - counselor training and implementation support
 - individual student planning and support
 - Course Choice/SCA Registration System administration
 - Course Choice/SCA program reporting
 - TOPS, LOSFA, Dual Enrollment, etc. information

Course Choice/SCA General FAQs

- 1. What information is needed to register for a SCA course?
 - Student first and last name, primary email address, alternate email address, telephone number, password, IEP/504
- 2. Does the counselor create the student account?

 The registrant creates the student account (school counselor,
 - administrator, etc.).

 Should the counselor's email address he entered as the primary
- 3. Should the counselor's email address be entered as the primary email during registration?
 - Since initial contact from the provider will be sent to the primary email account, it is a good idea to use the counselor's email address to verify course log-in information. After the registration process is complete, the email address and telephone number can be changed to the student's information.
- 4. Can you batch upload the students into the portal instead of individual registration?
 - At this time, a batch upload is not available.

CC/SCA General FAQs (cont.)

- 5. Can the SCA funds be used for dual enrollment courses? Yes
- 6. Is there a deadline for removing students from a course?

 Each enrollment period has a DROP/ADD period
- 7. Can a student work ahead and complete a course before the end of a semester/year?
 Yes
- 8. Are special considerations given to graduating seniors in the completion of their online course(s)?

Yes, arrangements will be made for graduating seniors

AP General FAQs

- 1. Should AP teachers complete an AP course audit each year?
 Yes; all AP courses must be renewed annually through the AP Course Audit.
- 2. Do students get the letter grade that corresponds with the numerical score?
 - This is a local decision based on the LEAs Pupil Progression Plan.
- 3. What letter grade does a student receive at the college level if they pass the course?
 - This varies by institution.
- 4. Do the colleges assign letter grades based on the numeric score? This varies by institution.
- 5. Would gifted students in lower HS grades be allowed to take AP courses?
 - Local policy dictates which grade levels are appropriate for AP coursework.

AP General FAQs (cont.)

- 6. When will AP Summer Institute funding be available?
 Applications for 2015 APSI fee reimbursement will be available via the Superintendent's Newsletter in early February 2015.
- 7. What about AP courses online? How does the AP Audit work with those courses?

The process is the same. All AP course instructors are required to participate in the AP course audit in order for the course to be transcribed as AP.
