Academic Content Standards Review Process 2015-2016



BESE Directives

In March, BESE called on the Department to present a plan to review Louisiana's English and math content standards. The plan continues the state's tradition of professional standards reviews, maintaining a Louisiana set of standards to continue on the path begun more than four years ago to raise student expectations and outcomes.

BESE required the Department commence the next scheduled review of state academic content standards in English language arts and mathematics, as required in Bulletin 741, §2301(C).

Louisiana Standards

The Department proposes a standards review process led by professional Louisiana educators that results in the best Louisiana standards for students.

State law (R.S. 17:24.4) requires BESE to approve "nationally recognized content standards that represent the knowledge and skills needed for students to successfully transition to post-secondary education and the workplace."

The Elementary and Secondary Education Act requires that states set forth challenging expectations for what public school children are expected to know and be able to do, that they contain coherent and rigorous content, and that they encourage the teaching of advanced skills.

BESE, in consultation with Louisiana educators and content experts, may adopt whatever standards meet these legal requirements. This includes making any adjustments or addition to present standards, which were developed by Louisiana and other states through the Common Core State Standards initiative. There is nothing in law or within the Common Core State Standards license documents preventing Louisiana from making whatever revisions or updates it determines are necessary to prepare our students for success and to fulfill legal requirements.

Standards Review

The following principles will guide this local review:

- 1. Consistency: The standards review will be consistent with the legally required process and with past Louisiana standards reviews.
- **2. Focus on the standards:** The review process will focus on the substance of the actual standards themselves.
- 3. Improve what exists today rather than start from scratch: The review process will improve current standards based on local, expert input and results, rather than requiring of teachers another five years of work to re-do classroom plans.
- **4. Public input:** The review process will include opportunities for the public to weigh in on every standard. In addition, all meetings will be open to the public.

Louisiana academic content standards should be a living set of nationally comparable expectations that adapt to student need. A standing Standards Committee will oversee the 2015-2016 review and will meet on an annual or as needed basis in subsequent years.

Given the technical nature of the work required to review content standards, at least half of this committee must be current Louisiana, district and school-based educators. Many of these members will also sit on one of three content subcommittees.
