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Why focus on Advanced Placement (AP®)?

- Louisiana Believes starts with the premise that all children can achieve high expectations.
- Research reports that students who complete AP® coursework are...
 - better prepared for college-level work,
 - stand outs in the admissions process,
 - more likely to continue beyond their freshman year in college,
 - more likely to graduate within 4-5 years, and
 - more competitive in qualifying for scholarships.

- Each student with at least one AP® score of 3 or higher will earn the maximum 150 points toward the graduation index.
- Students who take an AP®
 course and earn a 1 or 2 on an
 AP® exam receive 110 points
 toward the graduation index.

Do Colleges or Universities in Louisiana accept AP® or IB® credit?

►YES! A student <u>must</u> have taken the AP® or IB® Exam for the course that they are seeking credit.

- ► Each college or university has an AP® or IB® Policy regarding the issuance of credit based on the AP® or IB® Exam Score earned.
 - Information on score acceptance is generally found on the admissions page of each university.

How will LEAs be able to provide AP® offerings to their students?

- The Louisiana Department of Education has worked to secure funding to provide training for education leaders, teachers, and counselors.
 - Limited funding for attendance at AP® Summer Institutes for Teachers
 - Pre-AP and AP trainings through Laying the Foundation beginning in June 2013
- Since available funds are not sufficient to cover all AP® teachers in each subject, funds will be distributed via an application process. The application is open to all AP® teachers teaching in the 2013-2014 academic year at public, BESE approved non-public, and private schools.

Application Process

- Applications for all training opportunities will be made available via the LDE Newsletter on March 5, 2013
 - Applications are due by April 15, 2013
 - Notification will be made by April 29, 2013
 - Further information will be included in this notification
- Expenses
 - Registration and travel expenses* will be reimbursed by LDE

The AP® Course Audit

- To apply the AP® label to a student's report card or transcript, a high school must have an AP Course Audit account with an authorized syllabus for each AP® course they offer and identify on a report card or transcript.
- The AP® Course Ledger verifies each high school and the authorized courses they may apply the AP® label to.
 - State Departments of Education, colleges and universities refer to the AP® Course Ledger when verifying AP® courses on student transcripts when containing courses labeled as AP®. (https://apcourseaudit.epiconline.org/ledger/)
