JAG is a dropout prevention and recovery program that delivers a unique set of services for struggling students to help them earn a high school diploma and for out-of-school youth, to assist them in earning a high school equivalency diploma.

# JAG Specialist Schedule


#### JAG-LA Specialist Requirements:

- Schedules that allow flexibility due to the population being served.
- Schedules that allow time to complete all required JAG-LA duties.
- Specialists need time off-site to make employer out-reach visits which will include face-to-face visits to build relationships with community leaders, private industry, etc.

\* If the JAG Specialist is not leaving campus/agency, then JAG isn't being implemented properly.

## Student Selection/Load

Student load is a critical consideration when reviewing a program's ability to deliver quality services and to achieve program performance goals at a reasonable cost per placement.

# Student Selection

- Students are recommended for the program by an advisory committee
- Students are interviewed
- Specialists has the responsibility of making the final call of who participates in the program
- Students are made to feel special and provided information on the program

## JAG-LA Student's Served

#### JAG-LA is currently serving 3,140 Louisiana JAG students:


- Average barriers 9.15
- 1,666 (53%) male
- 1,462 (47%) female
- 70% black
- 24% white
- 36% live with both parents
- 91% on free or subsidized lunch
- 91% receive government assistance
- 42% represent bottom 25% of class standing
- 10% represent top 25% of class standing

## Career/Professional Association

Purpose of the Association:

- Officers can run for State Career Association Offices


## Career Association Activities

Services are provided to graduates and non-graduates for the duration of a 12 month period.

### **Services provided**

- Guidance in making plans for additional education
- Counseling to improve personal and job performance
- Feedback from employer to employee
- Encouragement to improve graduate's potential
- Assistance in achieving a positive change of status on the job
- Placement in a "quality job"



- JAG supports/compliments Jump Start
- Numerous JAG Students are part of the Jump Start Initiative
- Extra support with job skills that JAG offers greatly benefits students on the Career Diploma Pathway
- Developed Partnerships/Relationships with private industry and community leaders

## JAG-LA & Jump Start

## JAG-LA Supports Jump Start:

- Career Readiness Course
- Competency-based Curriculum (Work Skills)
- School to Career Transition System
- Mentor
- 12 months of follow-up
- Job Opportunities/Internships
- Introductions to different career choices
- Career and Interest Inventory Testing
- Financial Aid Planning Support

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## JAG-LA and Jump Start

- Identify the purpose/focus of the JAG-LA Program in individual districts:
  - ✓ Jump Start
  - ✓ Dropout Prevention
  - ✓ Both Jump Start and Dropout Prevention
- 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade "higher risk" students may be targets for the dropout prevention model of JAG. These students may require more attention from the JAG Specialist.
- 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students participating in Jump Start could be targeted for the school to career model of the program.

# Funding Sources

 Multi-Year, Middle and Out-of-School Programs are funded with TANF funding received from the Department of Children and Family Services

 Funding for JAG-LA AIM High! Programs are secured from IDEA funding

## 2015-2016 School Year

• Total of 69 JAG-LA Programs

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- ✓ **43** Multi-Year Programs
- ✓ 9 Middle School Programs
- ✓ **13** Aim High! Middle School Programs
- ✓ 4 Out-of-School Programs
- Estimated 3,125 active JAG-LA Students being served this school year
- An additional 576 JAG-LA Students receiving Follow-Up-Services

# JAG National Recognition

- 27 JAG-LA Sites received individual national recognition for achieving all 5 of the required outcomes set by the National JAG Organization.
- A number of specialists received special recognition awards for going above and beyond the requirements.
- Louisiana was also recognized for a number of awards including the "5 of 5" award for meeting all outcomes required by JAG.

## JAG-LA Multi-Year & Out-of-School Program Benchmarks

- 90% Graduation Rate for in-school programs
  50% Graduation Rate for out-of-school programs
- Postsecondary Education and/or entering the workforce in a quality job leading to a career
- 120 contact hours for in-school programs
  80 contact hours for out-of-school programs
- 15 hours of community service
- Attainment of required competencies

## JAG - LA Middle School Benchmarks

- 80% competency attainment
- 120 hours of contact hours
- 15 hours of community service
- Competency attainment (37 Competencies)
- Academic Remediation should count for a minimum of 15% of all contact hours
- 66% improvement on self-perception (pre and post-test scores by the end of 8<sup>th</sup> grade)

- Review Allowable and Non-Allowable Expenses. Budget will be loaded in e-GMS once BESE approves allocation.
- The Program Application is formatted to allow typing directly on the application.
- LEA District Supervisor must be identified to oversee the grant requirements
- District must identify a program model and the purpose of the grant.
