Social Studies Standards 2021 Draft Public Comments Overall Summary

On September 25, 2021, the Social Studies Standards Steering Committee voted to endorse the revised set of K-12 Louisiana Student Standards for Social Studies and have the Department submit them to BESE for approval in January. The public comment form was open September 30, 2021 through November 30, 2021. The following summary includes all public comments collected via the online form. All public comments received via email are listed in the appendix. User information such as role and parish were not collected via email and are therefore not included in the summary here.

Overview of the Standards Process

Louisiana state law (R.S. 17:24.4) requires the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) to adopt academic content standards, which are defined in the law as statements that define what a student should know or be able to accomplish at the end of a specific time period, grade level or at the completion of a course. The law sets forth an expectation that standards be rigorous and that they represent the knowledge and skills needed for students to successfully transition to postsecondary education and the workplace, as determined by content experts, elementary, secondary, and postsecondary educators and administrators and business and industry leaders. BESE Bulletin 741, §2301 states, "The Louisiana content standards shall be subject to review and revision to maintain rigor and high expectations for teaching and learning."

At the December 2020 meeting, the Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE) approved a nomination process for the Social Studies Content Standards Review Committee membership. On December 18, 2020, the announcement for volunteers to serve on the committees was released via a News Release and social media (Facebook and Twitter). The announcement was also shared via the January 26 School System Newsletter. The application was open for 45 days, from December 18th through February 1st. Louisiana teachers, staff, administrators, parents, students, and community members were encouraged to apply. 328 people volunteered to serve on the social studies standards review committees. The Louisiana Department of Education (LDE) selected proposed candidates from a list of nominees based on academic and professional achievement, as well as geographic and demographic diversity, for BESE approval. From these applications, three groups were formed: a steering committee (26 members), an elementary workgroup (18 members), and secondary workgroup (18 members). Some representatives served on both the committee and workgroups. BESE approved committee and workgroup membership on March 9, 2021.

On March 27, 2021, the steering committee voted to direct the workgroups to draft inquiry standards and content standards using a revised course progression. Members of the workgroups worked asynchronously to draft the standards, but two weeks prior to each of the steering committee meetings work paused to allow time for review from the steering committee and so that the draft standards could be publicly posted in the LDOE <u>Standards Review Committee Library</u>. Detailed information on the standards process can be found

in the LDOE Standards Review Committee Library.

This summary provides information on public comments collected through the online form on individual standards by unique users¹. When the form opened on September 30, users could only submit one comment per form. In response to public feedback, form submissions after October 14 had the option to submit more than one comment² per form. In response to public feedback received on November 23, 2021 the form was updated again to allow only one comment per form.

This summary was presented to the Academic Goals & Instructional Improvement Committee on December 14, 2021.




